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Kurt Kitayama

- Makes third appearance at 3M Open (T6/2024, Won/2025)
- Claimed second PGA TOUR title with victory at 2025 3M Open, highlighted by a career-low 60 in the third round; entered the week at No. 110 in the FedExCup and became the third consecutive 3M Open winner to begin the week outside the top 70 in the FedExCup (Jhonattan Vegas/No. 147/2024; Lee Hodges/No. 74/2023)
- Cumulative 36-under in eight rounds at TPC Twin Cities (66-69-70-66-65-71-60-65)
- Coming off a T40 finish at The Open Championship at Royal Birkdale
- Four top-10s in 18 starts this season, all of which coming in Signature Events or major championships: T2/The Genesis Invitational, T8/RBC Heritage, T9/Cadillac Championship, T10 PGA Championship

Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 makes his first appearance at the 3M Open one week after attempting to defend his 2025 Open Championship title; last World No. 1 to compete in the 3M Open: Brooks Koepka (2019/finished 65th)
- 20-time PGA TOUR winner previously won once in a tournament debut on TOUR (2025 Procore Championship)
- FedExCup leader in search of second victory of the season (The American Express)
- Enters the week off a T4 finish at The Open Championship, his 10th top-five finish in 16 starts on TOUR this season, the most by any player (next best: 7, Matt Fitzpatrick)
- Leads the PGA TOUR this season in top-10 finishes (10), top-25 finishes (15), Strokes Gained: Total (2.154), Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (1.655), Greens in Regulation (72.31%) and Scoring Average (68.24)

Aaron Wise

- 2018 CJ CUP Byron Nelson winner makes his 157th PGA TOUR start while seeking his second victory
- Former University of Oregon golfer was named PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year in 2018
- After starting this season with six consecutive missed cuts, finished T39 (John Deere Classic), T3 (ISCO Championship) and T15 (Corales Puntacana Championship) in his last three starts
- At one stroke off the lead, played in the final pairing in the final round at the 2026 ISCO Championship, en route to a T3 finish; marked his first time in the final pairing (or grouping) on the final day since the 2022 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (finished solo 2nd)
- Missed the cut (69-72) in his only prior appearance at the 3M Open (2020)
- His wife, Reagan, has been his caddie since returning to the TOUR after stepping away in 2023 to prioritize his mental health

Additional player notes:

- 24-year-old **Tom Kim's** win at the Genesis Scottish Open two weeks ago was his fourth PGA TOUR title and first in more than 1,000 days; one additional top-3 finish this season came at the U.S. Open (3rd); made 15 cuts in 18 starts this season
- **Maverick McNealy** makes his fifth appearance at the 3M Open; finished T3 in 2024 which included a third-round 63, one shy of his career-low round; made 15 cuts in 17 starts this season, including two top-10 results (10th/Farmers Insurance Open, T10/Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- 2015 PGA Championship winner and 2016 PLAYERS Championship winner **Jason Day** is one of six major champions, and three PLAYERS winners, in the field; makes his third appearance at the 3M Open (T66/2019, T64/2022); enters the week at No. 72 in the FedExCup
- 11-time PGA TOUR winner **Hideki Matsuyama** owns the longest active streak of consecutive cuts made on TOUR (28); makes fourth appearance at the 3M Open (T7/2019, WD/2022, T30/2023)

- PGA TOUR rookie and 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Player of the Year **Johnny Keefer** heads into the 3M Open at No. 71 in the FedExCup; notched T3 finishes at the Texas Children's Houston Open and the Genesis Scottish Open – the latter earning him a spot into The Open Championship (T59) to clinch the feat of playing all four major championships in his rookie season
- **Ben Kohles** heads into the 3M Open with momentum following a Korn Ferry Tour win in June (BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX); finished T3, two shots back, at the PGA TOUR's John Deere Classic in July after a final-hole double bogey; seeks first PGA TOUR title in his 122nd start
- With his one-stroke victory at the Corales Puntacana Championship, DP World Tour member **Stefano Mazzoli** earned PGA TOUR membership (thru 2027) and will compete at this week's 3M Open. Since 2023, DP World Tour members have had access to two PGA TOUR events (not including the co-sanctioned Genesis Scottish Open). This marks the first time a player in the field via the DP World Tour went on to win. Mazzoli, 29, is playing his first full season on the DP World Tour after earning promotion from the HotelPlanner Tour in 2025.
- **Preston Stout** makes sixth PGA TOUR start: MC/2025 3M Open, MC/2026 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, MC/2026 U.S. Open, T15/2026 John Deere Classic, T49/2026 ISCO Championship; a rising senior at Oklahoma State, he won the 2026 NCAA Individual title in June to close his season with five wins, the most by a junior in program history; current No. 1 in World Amateur Ranking is expected to be named as the (Class of 2027) Preseason No. 1 in PGA TOUR University sponsored by Huntington Bank
- **Preston Stout** is one of four sponsor exemptions in the field:
 - **Ryder Cowan** – rising senior at University of Oklahoma makes second PGA TOUR start (T23/2026 U.S. Open)
 - **Muzzy Donohue** – lefthander who won the 109th Minnesota State Open makes PGA TOUR debut
 - **Sihan Sandhu** – UNC golfer who won the 2026 Augusta Haskins Award Invitational makes PGA TOUR debut
- **Patrick Rodgers** makes his 332nd PGA TOUR start, the most of any active player seeking their first victory; owns four runner-up finishes among 31 top-10 results on TOUR; makes sixth 3M Open appearance with T32 in 2020 his best result; two players have earned their first PGA TOUR win at this event (**Lee Hodges**/2023, **Matthew Wollf**/2019)

3M Open notes:

- TPC Twin Cities was designed by World Golf Hall of Fame member Arnold Palmer, who worked in consultation with Minnesota native and PGA TOUR veteran Tom Lehman
- One of 10 TPC venues on 2026 PGA TOUR schedule: TPC Scottsdale, TPC Sawgrass (Stadium), TPC San Antonio (Oaks), TPC Louisiana, TPC Craig Ranch, TPC Toronto at Osprey Valley (North), TPC River Highlands, TPC Deere Run, TPC Twin Cities, TPC Southwind
- Eight players in the field have competed in all seven previous editions of the 3M Open: **Cam Davis, Tony Finau, Brice Garnett, Tom Hoge, Beau Hossler, Patton Kizzire, Peter Malnati, Troy Merritt**
- Four past champions of the 3M Open in the field: **Cameron Champ** (2021), **Tony Finau** (2022), **Lee Hodges** (2023), **Kurt Kitayama** (2025)
- Three FedExCup champions in the field: **Scottie Scheffler** (2024), **Billy Horschel** (2014), **Brandt Snedeker** (2012)
- Three players in the field at the 3M Open finished in the top 10 at last week's Open Championship: **Scottie Scheffler** (T4), **Casey Jarvis** (T6), **Rasmus Neergard-Petersen** (T9)
- Seven players in the field finished in the top 10 at last week's Corales Puntacana Championship: **Stefano Mazzoli** (Won), **Gordon Sargent** (T2), **Will Gordon** (T4), **Ben James** (T4), **Joe Highsmith** (T6), **Thorbjorn Olesen** (T6), **Zach Bauchou** (T9)
- TPC Twin Cities conceded five rounds of 62 or better in the 2025 3M Open (**Adam Svensson**/60/R1, **Kurt Kitayama**/60/R3, **Sam Stevens**/62/R1, **Thorbjorn Olesen**/62/R1, **Alex Noren**/62/R2) while just one round in the 80s was posted (81/R2/**Will Chandler**)
- The 3M Open has yet to experience a multiple winner or a playoff

PGA TOUR season notes

- Following the 3M Open, two events (Rocket Classic, Wyndham Championship) remain before the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will earn a spot in the FedExCup Playoffs
- **Scottie Scheffler** (3,823) holds a 737-point lead in the FedExCup standings over **Cameron Young** (3,086)
- **Matt Fitzpatrick** and **Chris Gotterup** lead the TOUR with three victories each this season; they join **Scottie Scheffler, Rory McIlroy** and **Ben Griffin** as the only players to earn three or more victories in a season on TOUR since 2024
- There have been 11 international winners on TOUR this season (13 wins)
- There have been six first-time winners in the first 31 events on TOUR this season: **Jacob Bridgeman** (The Genesis Invitational), **Ricky Castillo** (Puerto Rico Open), **Alex Fitzpatrick** (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), **Kristoffer Reitan** (Truist Championship), **Bud Cauley** (RBC Canadian Open), **Stefano Mazzoli** (Corales Puntacana Championship)
- The 54-hole leader/co-leader has gone on to win 10 of 30 individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season; the 54-hole leader/co-leader has gone on to win the 3M Open four times in seven editions of the event
