Rory McIlroy

- 2025 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion and three-time FedExCup Champion (2016, 2019, 2022) makes his season debut
- World No. 2 has won three times in his season debut on TOUR (2021 THE CJ CUP, 2022 THE CJ CUP, 2025 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Claimed his first of three victories of the 2025 season at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, later adding titles at THE PLAYERS Championship and Masters Tournament
- In 2025, closed with weekend rounds of 65-66 at Pebble Beach to claim a two-stroke victory over Shane Lowry
- Leads the field with 29 PGA TOUR victories
- Making his fourth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (MC/2018, T66/2024, 1st/2025)

Tommy Fleetwood

- 2025 FedExCup Champion and World No. 4 is making his season debut
- Won the FedExCup at the 2025 TOUR Championship, earning his first PGA TOUR title in his 164th start
- Had 30 top-five finishes on TOUR before collecting his first career title
- Recorded a total of eight top-10s and only missed one cut (U.S. Open) in 19 starts last season
- Making his fourth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T45/2019, T31/2024, T22/2025)

Chris Gotterup

- FedExCup leader and the season's first multiple winner will make his debut appearance at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- PGA TOUR wins (4): 2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, 2025 Genesis Scottish Open, 2026 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2026 WM Phoenix Open
- Won last week's WM Phoenix Open with a birdie-3 on the first playoff hole over Hideki Matsuyama
- Victory in Phoenix was his second victory in three starts this season (Farmers Insurance Open/T18) and his third victory in his last 10 starts on TOUR

Justin Rose

- 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion is making his first start since his seven-stroke triumph at the Farmers Insurance Open
- Victory at the Farmers Insurance Open marked his 13th PGA TOUR title in his 447th start
- After his win at Torrey Pines, moved from No. 10 to No. 3 in the Official World Golf Ranking, becoming the second-oldest player in the top-three of OWGR (Vijay Singh/45 years, 8 months)

- 2018 FedExCup Champion became ninth player to have 13 PGA TOUR victories or more including a FedExCup title; the others: Tiger Woods, Vijay Singh, Rory McIlroy, Dustin Johnson, Scottie Scheffler, Jim Furyk, Justin Thomas, Jordan Spieth
- Holds most wins on TOUR of any player from England since 1940 (next: Nick Faldo/9 wins)
- Making seventh start at the event, with four finishes of T11 or better (T6/2016, 1st/2023, T11/2024, T3/2025)

Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 is making his third career appearance at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T6/2024, T9/2025)
- Finished T3 at the WM Phoenix Open in bid to win three consecutive starts (2025 Procore Championship, 2026 American Express) for the first time in his career
- Enters the week with 17 straight top-10 finishes on TOUR, the first player since Billy Casper in 1965 to accomplish the feat
- Won his first start of the 2026 PGA TOUR Season at The American Express, marking his 20th career PGA TOUR title
 - Became the 40th player to reach 20 career wins and the first since Rory McIlroy reached the milestone in 2021
 - 20th win came in his 151st start on TOUR, marking the second-fewest starts to reach 20 wins (Tiger Woods/95)
- Won six times in 2025, his second consecutive season with at least six wins (2024/7), joining Tiger Woods (1999/8, 2000/9, 2005/6, 2006/8, 2007/7, 2009/6) as the only two players since 1983 to record 6+ wins in multiple seasons
- Finished last season inside the top 25 in all 20 starts, with a season-high 17 top-10 finishes
- Ranked first in scoring average in Round 1 (67.45), Round 2 (68.00), Round 3 (68.40) and Round 4 (68.10) in 2025, becoming the first player since Tiger Woods (2000) to lead the TOUR in all four categories in a single season

Jordan Spieth

- AT&T Ambassador and 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion makes his 14th career tournament appearance and owns six top-10s including his victory
- Seeks his first top-10 finish at Pebble Beach since his runner-up finish in 2022
- Making his 77th start since winning the 2022 RBC Heritage, the most recent of his 13 PGA TOUR victories
- Making his third start of the season T24/Sony Open in Hawaii, MC/WM Phoenix Open

AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am notes

- The AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is the fifth event of the 2026 PGA TOUR Season and first Signature Event; it features an 80-player field with no cut, a \$20 million purse and 700 FedExCup points to the winner
- The AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am celebrates its 80th playing in 2026, with Pebble Beach Golf Links serving as its host venue since 1947
- The event is played over two courses (Pebble Beach Golf Links, Spyglass Hill Golf Course), with amateurs competing alongside professionals the first two rounds, with competition limited to professionals only over the final two rounds at Pebble Beach
- The field features:
 - 42 of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking, including 18 of the top 20 in the world (No. 12 Justin Thomas/injury, No. 17 Patrick Reed)
 - Seven past champions: Jordan Spieth (2017), Nick Taylor (2020), Daniel Berger (2021), Tom Hoge (2022), Justin Rose (2023), Wyndham Clark (2024), Rory McIlroy (2025)
 - 64 PGA TOUR winners, led by Rory McIlroy (29) and Scottie Scheffler (20)
 - Eight past FedExCup Champions (10 wins): Billy Horschel/2014, Jordan Spieth/2015, Rory McIlroy/2016/2019/2022, Justin Rose/2018, Patrick Cantlay/2021, Viktor Hovland/2023, Scottie Scheffler/2024, Tommy Fleetwood/2025— Note: every FedExCup Champion dating to 2014 is in the field with the exception of Dustin Johnson/2020 and the injured Justin Thomas/2017
 - Sponsor exemptions: Tony Finau, Billy Horschel, Keith Mitchell, Sahith Theegala

- **Aon Next 10:** The Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational was determined through the 2025 FedExCup Fall standings, with Nos. 51-60 in the standings following The RSM Classic in November qualifying:

- **Aon Swing 5:** Last week's WM Phoenix Open, which followed the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express and Farmers Insurance Open, marked the final opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5 for entry into this week's AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and next week's Genesis Invitational.
 - Pierceson Coody posted his fourth consecutive top-20 finish to start the season with a T10 at last week's WM Phoenix Open. Coody is one of two players to finish inside the top 20 in the season's first four events (other: Si Woo Kim).
