**Akshay Bhatia (1<sup>st</sup>/-19)**

- Birdies six of his first seven holes en route to a 4-under 68 and two-stroke lead over Collin Morikawa, Sepp Straka and Jake Knapp
- Holds fourth 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recent: 2025 3M Open/finished T25); is 1-for-3 on converting a 54-hole lead to a victory (2024 Valero Texas Open)
- Making his 100th career start on TOUR and fourth start this season (MC/The American Express, MC/Farmers Insurance Open, T3/WM Phoenix Open)
- Marks third appearance at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T30/2021, T22/2025)
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner (2023 Barracuda Championship, 2024 Valero Texas Open) finished No. 13 in the 2025 FedExCup, his best finish in three seasons on TOUR

**Collin Morikawa (T2/-17)**

- Hit all 18 greens in regulation during a third-round and round of the day 62, including five birdies in his final six holes
- Marks the third time in his career to hit every green in regulation (2019 John Deere Classic/R4, 2025 Sentry/R3)
- Becomes the seventh player since 1985 to hit all 18 greens in regulation at Pebble Beach Golf Links during the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; the others: Akshay Bhatia (2021/R1), Ryan Palmer (2008/R2), Davis Love III (2006/R2), Tom Lehman (2000/R4), Peter Jacobsen (1995/R4), Jack Nicklaus (1985/R4)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (11.427), Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (8.891)
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner is seeking his first win since the 2023 Baycurrent Classic
- Making his third start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T14/2024, T17/2025); has shot under par in all 10 rounds at the event

**Miscellaneous Notes**

- **Sepp Straka** (T2/-17) is making his fourth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (MC/2019, T26/2024, T7/2025); held the 36-hole (by three) and 54-hole lead (by one over Shane Lowry and eventual champion Rory McIlroy) at the 2025 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Playing in back-to-back groups, **Jake Knapp** (T2/-17) and **Sam Burns** (T7/-14) hole out for eagles on the par-4 first hole from 130 and 156 yards, respectively; marks the fifth time the first hole has had multiple hole outs in a round, led by three during the final round in 2012 (Kevin Na, Tom Gillis, Brian Harman)
  - Knapp later eagled the par-5 18<sup>th</sup> hole to become the first player in a non-major championship at Pebble Beach Golf Links to bookend a round with eagles; he is the 10<sup>th</sup> player during the Shotlink era to start and finish a round with eagles

- Burns later birdied the 18<sup>th</sup> hole with a chip-in from 47' 2" off the green
- Notable players in the field:
  - World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T22/-11) trails by eight in bid for his 18<sup>th</sup> straight top-10 finish on TOUR
  - AT&T Ambassadors: **Maverick McNealy** (T7/-14), 2017 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion **Jordan Spieth** (T11/-13)
  - FedExCup leader **Chris Gotterup** (T22/-11)
  - Defending champion **Rory McIlroy** (T39/-9)
