Cameron Young (1st/-8)

- Opens with a bogey-free 8-under 64, his first opening bogey-free round since the 2024 Wyndham Championship
- 64 is one-stroke shy of his lowest opening-round score on TOUR (63, most recent: 2025 Wyndham Championship)
- Holds fourth 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recent: 2022 Open Championship/finished 2nd); 0-for-3 to date
- Needed only 20 putts in round one, the fewest in a round in his TOUR career (previous: 21; 2025 TOUR Championship/R2, 2025 RBC Heritage/R2)
- Tied for the most birdies (8) in round one and was perfect in Scrambling (8 of 8)
- Making ninth start of the season and has four top-10 finishes: T7/The Genesis Invitational, T3/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Won/THE PLAYERS Championship, T3/Masters Tournament
- Claimed second TOUR title with a win at THE PLAYERS Championship in March (other: 2025 Wyndham Championship)

Miscellaneous notes:

- Following a 10-year hiatus, the TOUR returns to Miami and the City of Doral for the inaugural Cadillac Championship (the event does not carry the history of previous PGA TOUR events contested at Doral); the Cadillac Championship will mark the 56th playing of a TOUR event at the famed Blue Monster having previously hosted the TOUR consecutively from 1962 to 2016
- Following the first round, the field is a collective 53-over on Nos. 17 and 18 at Trump National Doral’s Blue Monster and 79-under on the other 16 holes
- 13-time PGA TOUR winner **Jordan Spieth** (T2/-7) opens with a 65, his best round on TOUR since the 2025 Wyndham Championship (65/2025 Wyndham Championship/R1); one of 18 have players in the field that previously played a TOUR event held at Trump National Doral (2014-2016)
- **Alex Smalley** (T2/-7) records a 7-under 65, his second opening-round score of 65 or better this season (64/Sony Open in Hawaii); qualified this week by virtue of his position in the Aon Swing 5 (No. 4) after earning his third runner-up finish on TOUR at last week’s Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Hayden Springer)
- Canada’s **Nick Taylor** (4th/-6) posts a 6-under 66, highlighted by a 62’ 2” birdie putt on the par-3 15th hole, his fourth putt made over 60 feet in his TOUR career (in regulation play)
- World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T27/-1) was 3-under thru five holes before finishing with 1-under 71; 20-time PGA TOUR winner has 29 straight top-25 finishes on TOUR (last finish outside the top 25: 2024 BMW Championship/T33)
- Making first start as PGA TOUR member, **Alex Fitzpatrick** (T37/E) shoots even par; the 27-year-old earned his first TOUR victory at last week’s Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with brother and World No. 3 Matt Fitzpatrick) in his 11th start on TOUR
- **Adam Scott** (T66/+4) was assessed a two-stroke penalty during the first round for a breach of Rule 6.3c (wrong ball) that occurred on hole No. 8; Scott was winner of the 2016 WGC-Cadillac Championship, the most recent PGA TOUR event held at Trump National Doral prior to this week
- **Jake Knapp** (left thumb sprain) withdrew prior to his first round and was replaced by **Kristoffer Reitan** (T15/-2)
