**Cameron Young (1<sup>st</sup>/-13)**

- Posts a 5-under 67 in the second round, was 5-under par thru 13 before carding a bogey on the par-4 14<sup>th</sup>
- Holds third 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR in stroke-play events (2025 Wyndham Championship/Won, 2023 John Deere Classic/finished T6); 1-for-2 to date in converting to victory
- Matches best par-4 score to par thru 36-holes in PGA TOUR career: 8-under par (other: 2025 Wyndham Championship/Won)
- Holds a five-stroke lead after 36-holes, setting the largest 36-hole lead at Trump National Doral (previous: four shot lead, Lee Trevino/1973 Doral-Eastern Open/Won)
- Leads the field in Birdies (14), Scrambling (12 of 13) and Strokes Gained: Putting (5.500) after second round
- Opened with a first-round 8-under 64, one-stroke shy of his lowest opening-round score on TOUR (63, most recent: 2025 Wyndham Championship)
- Entered the week at No. 4 in the Official World Golf Ranking and FedExCup standings
- Making ninth start of the season and has four top-10 finishes: T7/The Genesis Invitational, T3/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Won/THE PLAYERS Championship, T3/Masters Tournament
- Claimed second TOUR title with a win at THE PLAYERS Championship in March (other: 2025 Wyndham Championship)

**Miscellaneous notes:**

- Canada's **Nick Taylor** (T2/-8) cards a second-round 70, highlighted by a chip-in eagle on No. 8 from 37 feet 11 inches; best finish in 11 starts on TOUR this season was a T13 at the Sony Open in Hawaii
- 13-time PGA TOUR winner **Jordan Spieth** (T2/-8) cards a 1-under 71 in the second round; last top-10 finish on TOUR was 16 starts ago at the 2025 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (T7); one of 18 have players in the field that previously played a TOUR event held at Trump National Doral (2014-2016)
- **Alex Smalley** (T2/-8) records a 1-under 71 in the second round; qualified this week by virtue of his position in the Aon Swing 5 (No. 4) after earning his third runner-up finish on TOUR at last week's Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Hayden Springer)
- Five-time PGA TOUR winner **Gary Woodland** (5<sup>th</sup>/-7) posts a 3-under 69 highlighted by an eagle on No. 1, marking the second time in his PGA TOUR career where he has made eagle on the opening hole of a round (other: R2/Hole 1/2012 WGC – Cadillac Championship)
- World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T6/-6) posts bogey-free 5-under 67, his 79th bogey-free round on TOUR (most on TOUR since 2019); 20-time PGA TOUR winner has 29 straight top-25 finishes on TOUR (last finish outside the top 25: 2024 BMW Championship/T33)
- Making first start as PGA TOUR member, **Alex Fitzpatrick** (T6/-6) posts a bogey-free 6-under 66 in the second round, one shy of his career-low 18-hole score (65/R3/2023 Open Championship/finished T17); the 27-year-old earned his first TOUR victory at last week's Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with brother and World No. 3 Matt Fitzpatrick) in his 11<sup>th</sup> start on TOUR
- Coming off a runner-up finish at last week's Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Kris Ventura), PGA TOUR rookie **Kristoffer Reitan** (T6/-6) cards bogey-free 68 in the second round; was the last man in the field after Jake Knapp withdrew prior to the first round
- **Kurt Kitayama** (T16/-4) cards an 8-under 64 to set low round of the day on Trump National Doral's Blue Monster
