**Cameron Young (1<sup>st</sup>/-15)**

- After entering the third round with a five-shot lead, cards a 70 and holds a six-stroke lead
- Matches largest 54-hole lead on TOUR this season (6 strokes: Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open/Won, Jacob Bridgeman/The Genesis Invitational/Won)
- Holds third 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and second this season; 1-for-2 to date in converting to victory
  - 2025 Wyndham Championship/Won
  - 2026 Masters Tournament/T3
- 28-year-old seeks his third career PGA TOUR victory and second this season in his 107th start
- PGA TOUR wins (2): 2026 PLAYERS Championship, 2025 Wyndham Championship
- Would join Matt Fitzpatrick (3) and Chris Gotterup (2) as players with multiple wins this season
- Would become the second wire-to-wire winner on TOUR this season (Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open)
- Leads the field in Birdies (18) and Scrambling (15 of 18)
- Stands at No. 4 in the Official World Golf Ranking and FedExCup standings
- Making ninth start of the season and has four top-10 finishes: T7/The Genesis Invitational, T3/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Won/THE PLAYERS Championship, T3/Masters Tournament

**Scottie Scheffler (T2/-9)**

- World No. 1 posts a third-round 69 and trails Cameron Young by six thru 54-holes
- Largest come-from-behind win of his career: 5 (2024 PLAYERS Championship)
- In search of his 21<sup>st</sup> win, which would move him to T32 on the PGA TOUR’s all-time wins list (others: Davis Love III, Willie MacFarlane, Lanny Wadkins, Craig Wood)
- Enters the week with 28 straight top-25 finishes on TOUR (last finish outside the top 25: 2024 BMW Championship/T33)
- 2024 FedExCup champion holds the TOUR’s current longest streak of consecutive made cuts (72)

**Miscellaneous notes:**

- **Si Woo Kim** (T2/-9) is making his 91<sup>st</sup> start since the most recent of his four PGA TOUR victories (2023 Sony Open in Hawaii) and has three top-3 finishes this season (T2/Farmers Insurance Open, T3/WM Phoenix Open, 3rd/RBC Heritage); most recent player from South Korea to win on TOUR: Tom Kim (2023 Shriners Children’s Open)
- Coming off a career-best runner-up finish at last week’s Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Kris Ventura), PGA TOUR rookie **Kristoffer Reitan** (T2/-9) was the last man in the field after Jake Knapp withdrew prior to the first round; the Norwegian seeks to become the fourth first-time TOUR winner this season (Jacob Bridgeman/The Genesis Invitational, Ricky Castillo/Puerto Rico Open, Alex Fitzpatrick/Zurich Classic of New Orleans)
- Canada’s **Nick Taylor** (T5/-8) seeks sixth TOUR victory and first since the 2025 Sony Open in Hawaii; best finish in 11 starts on TOUR this season was a T13 at the Sony Open in Hawaii
- **Michael Kim** (11<sup>th</sup>/-6) records a 7-under 65, the low round of the day on Trump National Doral’s Blue Monster
- Current standings from notable players in the field:
  - 13-time PGA TOUR winner **Jordan Spieth** (T12/-5)
  - Winner of last week’s Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with brother Matt) **Alex Fitzpatrick** (T16/-4)
  - 2016 WGC-Cadillac Championship winner **Adam Scott** (T23/-3)
