**Final-Round Notes – Sunday, May 3, 2026**

**Weather:** Scattered Thunderstorms. High of 82. Wind NNW 5-10 mph. Due to inclement weather, the final round featured revised tee times off Nos. 1 & 10 from 9:30 a.m. – 11:42 p.m. local time. Preferred lies were in effect for the final round.

**Cameron Young (1<sup>st</sup>/-19)**

- Earns his third career PGA TOUR victory and second this season in his 107<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 28 years, 11 months, 27 days
- PGA TOUR wins (3): 2025 Wyndham Championship, 2026 PLAYERS Championship, 2026 Cadillac Championship
- Earns his fifth top-10 finish in nine starts on TOUR this season (T7/The Genesis Invitational, T3/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Won/PLAYERS Championship, T3/Masters Tournament, Won/Cadillac Championship)
- Joins Matt Fitzpatrick (3) and Chris Gotterup (2) as players with multiple wins this season
- Becomes the second wire-to-wire winner on TOUR this season (Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open) and first time there are multiple wire-to-wire winners on TOUR since 2022 (Joaquin Niemann/Genesis Invitational, J.T. Poston/John Deere Classic)
- Earns 700 FedExCup points and moves from No. 4 to No. 3 in both the Official World Golf Ranking and FedExCup standings
- After entering the final round with a six-shot lead, cards a 4-under 68 to win by six strokes, one shy of the largest margin of victory on TOUR this season (seven shots: Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open)
- Called a penalty on himself on the par-4 No. 2 and was assessed a one-stroke penalty for a breach of Rule 9.4 (player caused their ball at rest to move); made 13ft 6in putt to save par
- Led the field in Birdies (24) and Strokes Gained: Putting (7.062)

**Miscellaneous notes:**

- World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-13) finishes runner-up for the third consecutive time (2<sup>nd</sup>/Masters Tournament, P2/RBC Heritage, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Cadillac Championship), becoming the first player since Sergio Garcia in 2014 to finish runner-up in three consecutive starts; earns his 29<sup>th</sup> straight top-25 finish on TOUR (last finish outside the top 25: 2024 BMW Championship/T33)
- Three-time TOUR winner **Ben Griffin** (3<sup>rd</sup>/-12) posts a 4-under 68 in the final round; marks his second consecutive top-10 result this season (T10/Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 3<sup>rd</sup>/Cadillac Championship)
- 2016 WGC-Cadillac Championship winner **Adam Scott** (T4/-11) records an 8-under 64, one of the low rounds of the day on Trump National's Blue Monster (other: Sahith Theegala); posted a 66-64 in his last two rounds, marking his first back-to-back rounds of 6-under par or better since 2019 (other: R2/R3/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- **Sepp Straka** (T4/-11) earns his third top-10 finish this season (T2/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T8/THE PLAYERS Championship, T4/Cadillac Championship) just one week before he is set to defend at the Truist Championship
- Winner of last week's Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with brother Matt) **Alex Fitzpatrick** (T9/-9) posts a 9-under 279 in his first start as a PGA TOUR member; earns his second top-10 finish in two starts this season (Won/Zurich Classic of New Orleans, T9/Cadillac Championship)
- The 18<sup>th</sup> hole of Trump National Doral's Blue Monster course played as the toughest final hole on TOUR this season at an average of 0.382 strokes over par (next hardest: TPC Sawgrass/0.34 strokes over par)

**Aon Swing 5 and Next 10**
