**Justin Rose (1<sup>st</sup>/-10)**

- 2019 Farmers Insurance Open winner opens with a 10-under 62 on the North Course and holds a one-stroke lead
- 62 marks lowest score in 51 rounds at the Farmers Insurance Open (previous: 63/R1/Won)
- Records a birdie on every par 3 in the round for the first time in his 1,506th career round
- Leads the field in birdies (10), including the four par-3 holes on the North Course
- One of seven past champions in the field, has four top-10s in 15 starts at the event
- Making second start of the season (MC/The American Express)
- 12-time PGA TOUR winner most recently won the first FedExCup Playoffs event of the 2025 season, defeating J.J. Spaun at the FedEx St. Jude Championship

**With the 18-hole lead/co-lead**

- Holds the first-round lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR for the 21st time
- 2-for-20 converting to victory (2010 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2011 BMW Championship)
- Marks sixth lead/co-lead at the Farmers Insurance Open, the most leads/co-leads after any round at the event since 2016 (next: 4/Jon Rahm)
- At 45 years, 5 months, 30 days, marks the first time in 21 years a player 45 years or older has held the 18-hole lead/co-lead at the Farmers Insurance Open (first since: Tom Lehman/2005/45 years, 10 months, 13 days)
- Since 1988, the Farmers Insurance Open has had only one winner who held the first-round lead/co-lead and went on to win: Patrick Reed (2021)

**Miscellaneous Notes**

- With eagles on No. 9 and No. 17 on the North Course, **Justin Lower** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-9) records two eagles in a round for the second time in his career in his 374th round (other: 2025 American Express/R1)
- Making his third start at the Farmers Insurance Open, **Max Greyserman** (T3/-8) opens with an 8-under 64; owns five runner-up finishes in 56 starts (2024 3M Open, 2024 Wyndham Championship, 2024 Baycurrent Classic, 2025 Rocket Classic, 2025 Baycurrent Classic)
- **Hideki Matsuyama** (T3/-8), one of 10 major championship winners in the field is making his 13th consecutive appearance at the Farmers Insurance Open (best finish, T3/2019)
- **Seamus Power** (T5/-7) recorded the low round on the South Course with a 7-under 65; birdied every par 3 on the South Course, marking the first player since Emiliano Grillo (2023/R1) to do so

- With a first-round 3-under 69 at the North Course, two-time winner of the Farmers Insurance Open **Brandt Snedeker** (2012, 2016) has 38 rounds under par at this event, the most of any player since 2010 (next: 35/Keegan Bradley)
- Defending champion **Harris English** (T102/+1) posts 1-over 73 at the South Course; owns three top-10 finishes in 12 appearances at the Farmers Insurance Open (others: T2/2015, T8/2018)
- Making his first start in a non-major on the PGA TOUR since the 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play (a span of 1,404 days) via the Returning Member Program, **Brooks Koepka** (T102/+1) opens with a 1-over 73 at the South Course; the nine-time winner is making his 187<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start and fifth at the Farmers Insurance Open where he has made the cut once (T41/2015)
