Justin Rose (1st/-21)

- 2019 Farmers Insurance Open winner holds the 54-hole lead/co-lead by six strokes; largest 54-hole leader at the Farmers Insurance Open (since 1983): 8/Tiger Woods/2008/Won)
 - Marks the largest 54-hole lead on TOUR since Scottie Scheffler at the 2025 THE CJ Cup at Bryon Nelson (8 strokes)
 - Posts 21-under 195, sets low 54-hole score at this event since 1983 (previous: 198/Justin Rose/2019, Kyle Stanley/2012, Tiger Woods/2008, Woody Blackburn/1985)
 - Seeks his 13th PGA TOUR title in his 447th start at the age of 45 years, 6 months, 2 days
 - Most recent win: 2025 FedEx St. Jude Championship
 - One of seven past champions in the field; has four top-10s in 15 starts at the event seeks to become the event's 10th multiple winner and first since Jason Day (2018)
 - With a victory, would extend his record to 13 wins on the PGA TOUR, the most by a player from England (next: Nick Faldo/9)
 - With a win, would be the oldest wire-to-wire winner on TOUR since Rocco Mediate (2010 Procore Championship)
 - Most recent wire-to-wire winner at the Farmers Insurance Open: Tommy Bolt (1955)
 - Making second start of the season (MC/The American Express)
 - 2016 Olympic gold medalist featured in two high-profile playoffs last season: won the first FedExCup Playoffs event defeating J.J. Spaun at the FedEx St. Jude Championship; was defeated by Rory McIlroy at the Masters Tournament
- With the 54-hole lead/co-lead**
- Holds the third-round lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR for the 18th time (also led at the 2016 Olympics through 54-holes and went on to win)
 - 6-for-17 converting to victory (most recent: 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
 - Marks eighth lead/co-lead at the Farmers Insurance Open, the most leads/co-leads after any round at the event since 2016 (next: 4/Jon Rahm)

Miscellaneous Notes

- 2021 Corales Puntacana winner **Joel Dahmen** (2nd/-15) seeks second PGA TOUR title; is playing out of the No. 111-125 FedExCup Fall standings, got into the field on Monday when Patton Kizzire withdrew; a top-10 finish would mark his third at the Farmers Insurance Open (T9/2019, T9/2025), the most at an event in his PGA TOUR career
- **Ryo Hisatsune** (T3/-13) looks to improve his best TOUR result in his 65th start (T3/2024 Wyndham Championship)
- **Si Woo Kim's** (T3/-13) best result in eight previous starts at the Farmers Insurance Open: T11/2022
- Making his third appearance at this event (MC/2022, WD/2025) **Max McGreevy** (5th/-12) seeks his first PGA TOUR win in his 101st start on TOUR

- Defending champion **Harris English** (T20/-8) posts third-round 67, one stroke shy of his low 18-hole score at the Farmers Insurance Open (66/R3/2025; 66/R2/2015)
- Making his first start in a non-major on the PGA TOUR since the 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play via the Returning Member Program, **Brooks Koepka** (T61/-2) posts 1-over 73; the nine-time winner is making his 187th PGA TOUR start and fifth at the Farmers Insurance Open
