**Justin Rose (Winner/-23)**

- Earns 13<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR title in his 447<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 45 years, 6 months, 2 days
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and moves in a tie for No. 3 in FedExCup standings with World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler
- Moves from No. 10 to No. 3 in the Official World Golf Ranking, becoming the second-oldest player in the top-three of OWGR (Vijay Singh/45 years, 8 months)

**13<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR victory**

- Becomes 85<sup>th</sup> player in PGA TOUR history to reach 13 wins and moves to T73 on the all-time wins list
- 2018 FedExCup champion becomes ninth player to have 13 PGA TOUR victories or more including a FedExCup title (Tiger Woods, Vijay Singh, Rory McIlroy, Dustin Johnson, Scottie Scheffler, Jim Furyk, Justin Thomas, Jordan Spieth)
- First victory since 2025 FedEx St. Jude Championship; wins in back-to-back seasons for first time since 2019
- Holds most wins on TOUR of any player from England since 1940 (next: Nick Faldo/9 wins)
- Marks first player from England to win on TOUR since Tommy Fleetwood at the 2025 TOUR Championship

**Wire-to-wire**

- Becomes the oldest wire-to-wire winner on TOUR since Rocco Mediate (2010 Procore Championship/47 years)
- First wire-to-wire winner on TOUR since Scottie Scheffler at the 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson
- Third wire-to-wire winner (fourth instance) in tournament history: Ted Kroll (1952), Tommy Bolt (1953, 1955)

**Seven-stroke victory**

- Becomes the oldest winner of the Farmers Insurance Open (previous: Marty Furgol/1959/43)
- 265 (-23) marks lowest 72-hole score in tournament history (previous 266: George Burns/1987, Tiger Woods/1999)
- Seven-stroke margin is the largest margin of victory at the event since Tiger Woods in 2008 (8 strokes)
- Becomes first player 45 years or older since Loren Roberts (2000 Greater Milwaukee Open) to win by seven or more strokes on TOUR
- 2019 Farmers Insurance Open winner becomes 10 multiple-time winner of event and first since Jason Day (2018)
- Win comes in 16<sup>th</sup> start at the event and his fifth top-10 (T4/2017, T8/2018, Won/2019, T6/2022, Won/2026)
- Improves to 7-for-18 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR
- Additional highlights this week include, setting the Farmers Insurance 36-hole scoring record at 127 (-17)

**Miscellaneous Notes**

- With a 7-under 65, the low round of the day, **Pierceson Coody** (T2/-16) collects second runner-up in his 56<sup>th</sup> start on TOUR (2024 ISCO Championship)

- Making his ninth start at the event, four-time PGA TOUR winner **Si Woo Kim** (T2/-16) earns his best finish since the 2023 CJ CUP Byron Nelson (T2); marks second consecutive top-10 of the season (T6/The American Express)
- **Ryo Hisatsune** (T2/-16) finishes runner-up, his best result in his 65<sup>th</sup> start on TOUR (previous: T3/2024 Wyndham Championship)
- **Joel Dahmen** (T7/-14) records third top-10 at the Farmers Insurance Open (T9/2019, T9/2025, T7/2026), the most at an event in his PGA TOUR career
- Making his first start in a non-major on the PGA TOUR since the 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play via the Returning Member Program, nine-time TOUR winner **Brooks Koepka** finishes T56 in his 187<sup>th</sup> start and fifth at the Farmers Insurance Open

#### **Aon Swing 5**

- The Farmers Insurance Open is the third of a four-tournament stretch for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5 with entry into the next two Signature Events; the top five players, not otherwise exempt, who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express, the Farmers Insurance Open and the WM Phoenix Open will qualify for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
