Viktor Hovland

- Earned his eighth PGA TOUR victory in a playoff over Scottie Scheffler in his most recent start at Travelers Championship
- Became eighth international winner (10th win) this season and second Norwegian (Kristoffer Reitan/Truist Championship)
- Making fifth consecutive start at the Genesis Scottish Open (best: T11/2025)
- Enters the week No. 20 in the FedExCup standings and No. 13 in the Official World Golf Ranking

Aaron Rai

- Earned his breakthrough DP World Tour victory at The Renaissance Club during the 2020 Genesis Scottish Open, defeating Tommy Fleetwood in a playoff
- Englishman is making his ninth consecutive start at the Genesis Scottish Open and fifth since the event became co-sanctioned by the PGA TOUR and DP World Tour
- Reigning PGA Championship winner became the eighth Englishman to win a major championship since 1940
- Has two TOUR victories (2024 Wyndham Championship, 2026 PGA Championship) and owns three career wins each on the DP World Tour and HotelPlanner Tour
- Enters the week No. 27 in the FedExCup standings and No. 16 in the Official World Golf Ranking

Chris Gotterup

- Won the 2025 Genesis Scottish Open by two strokes over fellow 54-hole co-leader Rory McIlroy and Marco Penge
- Week was highlighted by a career-best, course record-tying 9-under 61 in the second round
- Seeks to become the first player to successfully defend at the Genesis Scottish Open
- Captured fifth victory and third of the season at last week's John Deere Classic (others: Sony Open in Hawaii, WM Phoenix Open)
- Third-year PGA TOUR member owns wins in each of his three seasons on TOUR (five total wins in 85 career starts)
- One of four players with multiple wins on TOUR this season (3/Matt Fitzpatrick, 2/Wyndham Clark, 2/Cameron Young)
- With the win last week, moved to No. 6 in the FedExCup standings and No. 7 in the Official World Golf Ranking

Scottie Scheffler

- Making his fifth career start at the Genesis Scottish Open (best: T3/2023) one week before defending his 2025 Open Championship title
- Enters the week off a playoff loss to Viktor Hovland at the Travelers Championship, his 14th career runner-up finish and fourth this season
- FedExCup leader and 20-time PGA TOUR winner in search of second victory of the season (The American Express)
- World No. 1 holds 35 straight top-25 finishes, the second most in the past 40 years (most: 38/Tiger Woods)
- Holds the TOUR's current longest streak of consecutive made cuts (78); last missed cut came at the 2022 FedEx St. Jude Championship
- Leads the TOUR in top-10 finishes (9), SG: Total (2.249), GIR% (72.52%), Scoring Average (68.18) and Birdie Average (4.82 per round)

Rory McIlroy

- 2023 Genesis Scottish Open winner has finished inside the top five the last three starts at the event (Won/2023, T4/2024, T2/2025)
- World No. 2 is making 10th start on TOUR this season and first start since the U.S. Open (T32)
- 30-time PGA TOUR winner's season highlighted by a win (Masters Tournament) and runner-up (The Genesis Invitational)
- Seeks his fifth consecutive season with multiple PGA TOUR titles
- Would become the first player to win the Masters Tournament and Genesis Scottish Open in the same season

Robert MacIntyre

- Won the 2024 Genesis Scottish Open by one stroke over Adam Scott, his second TOUR title (2024 RBC Canadian Open)
- Joined Colin Montgomerie (1999) as players from Scotland to win the Genesis Scottish Open
- Has four top-10 finishes in 16 starts this season, with his best finish being runner-up at the Valero Texas Open
- Enters the week No. 34 in the FedExCup standings and No. 20 in the Official World Golf Ranking

Brooks Koepka

- Playing on a sponsor exemption, nine-time winner is making his Genesis Scottish Open debut and 200th PGA TOUR start
- Enters the week ninth on TOUR in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (0.589)
- Has one top 10 in 13 starts this season (T9/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches) and making first start since the U.S. Open (MC)
- Enters the week No. 81 in the FedExCup; would be eligible to compete in the FedExCup Playoffs as part of the Returning Member Program

Genesis Scottish Open notes

- The Genesis Scottish Open is the 28th event of the FedExCup Regular Season, with only five weeks remaining until the start of the FedExCup Playoffs
- Marks the fifth consecutive year that the Genesis Scottish Open is co-sanctioned by the PGA TOUR and DP World Tour as part of the Strategic Alliance between both Tours, while the Renaissance Club hosts the Genesis Scottish Open for the eighth consecutive year
- The field includes:
 - Six of the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking
 - Four past champions among the current top 20 in the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 2 **Rory McIlroy**/2023, No. 7 **Chris Gotterup**/2025, No. 14 **Xander Schauffele**/2022, No. 20 **Robert MacIntyre**/2024)
 - 48 of the top 70 in the FedExCup standings
 - 35 of the 156 players in the field competed at last week's John Deere Classic, including winner **Chris Gotterup**; **Doug Ghim** (T6) and **Mac Meissner** (T6) also finished inside the top 10
 - World Golf Hall of Fame member **Padraig Harrington** successfully defended his U.S. Senior Open title
- The Genesis Scottish Open is the final event of The Open Qualifying Series (OQS) where three spots will be available into next week's 154th Open at Royal Birkdale Golf Club; the top three players, not otherwise exempt, who make the cut at the Genesis Scottish Open will earn an exemption; in the event of a tie for a qualifying place, the player with the higher position in the Official World Golf Ranking entering the week will earn the spot

PGA TOUR season notes

- **Scottie Scheffler** (3,511) holds a 316-point lead in the FedExCup standings over **Matt Fitzpatrick** (3,195)
- **Matt Fitzpatrick** and **Chris Gotterup** lead the TOUR with three victories each this season; they join **Scottie Scheffler**, **Rory McIlroy** and **Ben Griffin** as the only players to earn three or more victories in a season on TOUR since 2024
- There have been eight international winners on TOUR this season (10 wins)
- There have been five first-time winners in the first 27 events on TOUR this season: **Jacob Bridgeman** (The Genesis Invitational), **Ricky Castillo** (Puerto Rico Open), **Alex Fitzpatrick** (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), **Kristoffer Reitan** (Truist Championship), **Bud Cauley** (RBC Canadian Open); the Genesis Scottish Open has not had a first-time winner the past five editions
- The 54-hole leader/co-leader has gone on to win 10 of 25 individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season; the 54-hole leader/co-leader at the Genesis Scottish Open has gone on to win three of the last four years (**Chris Gotterup**/2025, **Rory McIlroy**/2023, **Xander Schauffele**/2022)
