Jordan Smith (T1/-9)

- PGA TOUR rookie holds 36-hole lead/co-lead for the second time on TOUR (2026 Charles Schwab Challenge/finished T13)
- Career-best finish on TOUR in 34 starts is solo-third finish at the 2026 Valspar Championship
- Seeks to become the third rookie winner on TOUR this season (Alex Fitzpatrick/Zurich Classic of New Orleans, Kristoffer Reitan/Truist Championship)
- Seeks to become the sixth first-time winner on TOUR this season and first since Bud Cauley (RBC Canadian Open)
- Making fifth start at Genesis Scottish Open (T24/2022, T12/2023, MC/2024, T22/2025)
- Enters the week at No. 73 in the FedExCup standings and owns five top-25 finishes in 16 starts this season
- Earned PGA TOUR card for the 2026 season by finishing inside the top 10 of the 2025 DP World Tour Eligibility Ranking
- Owns two DP World Tour victories: 2017 Porsche European Open, 2022 Portugal Masters

Tom Kim (T1/-9)

- Holds third career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2022 Wyndham Championship/Won, 2024 Travelers Championship/P2)
- One of two players to finish inside the top 25 at the Genesis Scottish Open since 2022 (other: Wyndham Clark)
- Enters the week No. 58 in the FedExCup; has two top-10s in 16 starts this season (T6/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, 3rd/U.S. Open)
- PGA TOUR wins (3): 2022 Wyndham Championship, 2022 Shriners Children's Open, 2023 Shriners Children's Open

Rory McIlroy (T1/-9)

- Has played all 14 rounds of his career at this event in the 60s, the highest percentage of any player at this event since 2022
- 2023 Genesis Scottish Open winner has finished inside the top five the last three starts at the event (Won/2023, T4/2024, T2/2025)
- Holds 13th career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and second this season (Masters Tournament/Won); 7-for-12 to date
- World No. 2 is making 10th start on TOUR this season and has a win (Masters Tournament) and runner-up (The Genesis Invitational)
- Seeks 31st PGA TOUR victory and with a win would tie Jimmy Demaret (15th all time)
- Would become the first player to win the Masters Tournament and Genesis Scottish Open in the same season
- 30-time PGA TOUR winner has earned five PGA TOUR wins internationally, the most of any player since 2003
- Seeks his fifth consecutive season with multiple PGA TOUR titles

Additional notes

- **Matt Fitzpatrick** (T4/-8) seeks to become the first player from England to earn four wins in a season and the first player to earn four or more wins in a season since Scottie Scheffler in 2025 (wins: Valspar Championship, RBC Heritage, Zurich Classic of New Orleans); trails FedExCup leader Scheffler (3,511) by 316 points in the FedExCup standings and holds the TOUR's current longest streak of consecutive made cuts with 28 (last missed cut: 2025 Zurich Classic of New Orleans)
- **Min Woo Lee** (T4/-8) seeks his second PGA TOUR victory (2025 Texas Children's Houston Open); has three top-10s in 15 starts this season (best: T2/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Five-time PGA TOUR winner **Chris Gotterup** (T6/-7) is seeking to successfully defend his first title on TOUR and become the first player to successfully defend at the Genesis Scottish Open
- With a second-round 2-over 72, World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler's** (MC/E) longest active streak of 78 made cuts on TOUR comes to an end (last missed cut prior to this week: 2022 FedEx St. Jude Championship/1,428 days ago); FedExCup leader and 20-time PGA TOUR winner snaps a streak of 35 straight top-25 finishes, the second most in the past 40 years (most: 38/Tiger Woods)
