Weather: Saturday: Cloudy with areas of fog. High of 61. Wind ENE 10-15 mph, gusts up to 19 mph. **Sunday:** Mostly cloudy. High of 59. Wind ENE 10-15 mph, gusts up to 18 mph.

Suspension summary: Due to fog in the area, round three was suspended at 10:45 a.m. BST and resumed at 1:10 p.m. (delay of 2 hours and 25 minutes). The third round was suspended again at 7:55 p.m. due to fog in the area and eventually suspended for the day with a resumption time scheduled for 7:00 a.m. Sunday. The third round resumed Sunday at 7:00 a.m. and was completed at 9:43 a.m. The final round began as scheduled, featuring groups of three from 10:25 a.m. – 2:50 p.m. off No. 1.

Robert MacIntyre (T1/-12)

- Seeks third PGA TOUR victory in 94th start (2024 Genesis Scottish Open, 2024 RBC Canadian Open)
- Holds fourth 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; is 1-for-3 to date in converting to victory (RBC Canadian Open)
- Won the 2024 Genesis Scottish Open by one stroke over Adam Scott
- Joined Colin Montgomerie (1999) as players from Scotland to win the Genesis Scottish Open
- Would mark the 16th win from Scotland and move to solo-third on all-time winners from Scotland (6/Sandy Lyle, 4/Martin Laird)
- Has four top-10 finishes in 16 starts this season, with his best finish being runner-up at the Valero Texas Open
- Enters the week No. 34 in the FedExCup standings and No. 20 in the Official World Golf Ranking

Min Woo Lee (T1/-12)

- Seeks his second PGA TOUR victory in his 84th start (2025 Texas Children's Houston Open)
- Holds second 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (Texas Children's Houston Open/Won)
- Has three top-10s in 15 starts this season (best: T2/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Earned his second DP World Tour victory at The Renaissance Club during the 2021 Genesis Scottish Open, defeating Thomas Detry and Matt Fitzpatrick in a playoff

Matt Fitzpatrick (T1/-12)

- Seeks sixth PGA TOUR victory and fourth this season in his 193rd start (Valspar Championship, RBC Heritage, Zurich Classic of New Orleans)
- Holds sixth 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; is 3-for-5 to date in converting to victory (2022 U.S. Open, 2025 RBC Heritage, 2026 RBC Heritage)
- One of two players with three wins this season (other: Chris Gotterup)
- Would become the first player from England to earn four wins in a season and the first player to earn four or more wins in a season since Scottie Scheffler in 2025
- With a win, would reclaim the lead in the 2026 FedExCup standings; currently trails Scheffler (3,511) by 316 points
- Holds the TOUR's current longest streak of consecutive made cuts with 28 (last missed cut: 2025 Zurich Classic of New Orleans)

Additional notes

- Making Genesis Scottish Open debut, **Michael Thorbjornsen** (T4/-11) seeks to become the sixth first-time winner on TOUR this season and first since Bud Cauley (RBC Canadian Open); career-best finish on TOUR in 62 starts is runner-up: 2024 John Deere Classic, 2025 Corales Puntacana Championship
- Five-time PGA TOUR winner **Chris Gotterup** (T4/-11) is seeking to successfully defend his first title on TOUR and become the first player to successfully defend at the Genesis Scottish Open
- 30-time PGA TOUR winner and 2023 Genesis Scottish Open winner **Rory McIlroy** (T26/-6) posts 3-over 73 in the third round, snapping his streak of 14 rounds of his career at this event in the 60s

- The Genesis Scottish Open is the final event of The Open Qualifying Series (OQS) where three spots will be available into next week's 154th Open at Royal Birkdale Golf Club; the top three players, not otherwise exempt, who make the cut at the Genesis Scottish Open will earn an exemption; in the event of a tie for a qualifying place, the player with the higher position in the Official World Golf Ranking entering the week will earn the spot
