Chris Gotterup (1st/-20)

- Picks up his fifth career PGA TOUR victory in his 85th start at the age of 26 years, 11 months, 16 days
- PGA TOUR wins (5): 2024 Myrtle Beach Classic, 2025 Genesis Scottish Open, 2026 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2026 WM Phoenix Open, 2026 John Deere Classic
- Entered the final round five shots back, two shy of the largest come-from-behind victory in tournament history: 7 shots, Roger Maltbie/1975; five shots back marks his largest come-from-behind victory on TOUR (previous: four shots back, 2026 WM Phoenix Open)
- Posts a bogey-free 9-under 62, his second-lowest 18-hole score in 279 rounds (best 18-hole score: 61/R2/Genesis Scottish Open); carded nine birdies in the final round, matching his career high (other: 2026 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/R1)
- The victory comes in his fourth appearance at the John Deere Classic (T4/2022, MC/2024, T21/2025, Won/2026)
- Wins in his 17th start this season, highlighted by three victories (Sony Open in Hawaii, WM Phoenix Open, John Deere Classic)
- Becomes fifth player to earn fifth win in 85 starts or less since 2000 (Collin Morikawa/51st start/2021 The Open Championship, Bryson DeChambeau/73rd start/2018 Shriners Children's Open, Jordan Spieth/76th start/2015 John Deere Classic, Rory McIlroy/52nd start/2012 Dell Technologies Championship)
- One of four players who have multiple wins on TOUR this season: Matt Fitzpatrick (3), Cameron Young (2), Wyndham Clark (2)
- Matches second-most wins since mid-May 2024: Scottie Scheffler/10, Rory McIlroy/5, Chris Gotterup/5
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and moves from No. 12 to No. 6 in the FedExCup standings
- Entered the week as the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 14 in the Official World Golf Ranking

Additional Player Notes

- Six-time PGA TOUR winner **Max Homa** (2/-19) posts a final round 7-under 64 to record his first top-3 finish since the 2024 Masters Tournament and best finish of the season (T9/Masters Tournament)
- 54-hole co-leader **Lucas Glover** (T3/-18) posts a final round 69 to finish tied for third, his best finish on TOUR this season (previous: T14/Cadillac Championship)
- With a final round 4-under 69, 54-hole co-leader **Lee Hodges** (T3/-18) posts his best finish at the John Deere Classic (previous: T21/2025) and his second top-10 this season (T6/Sony Open in Hawaii)
- **Ben Kohles** (T3/-18) cards a final round 3-under 68 to post his second-best finish in 120 starts on TOUR (2nd/2024 CJ CUP Byron Nelson) as he looked to become the first player since Matt McCarty in 2024 to win on the PGA TOUR and Korn Ferry TOUR in the same season (2026 BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX)
- Cedar Rapids, Iowa native **Zach Johnson** (T9/-16) becomes the third player, 50 years or older, to finish inside in the top-10 at the John Deere Classic (others: 1974/Sam Snead/62 years old/finished 4th, 2017/Steve Stricker/50 years old/finished T5)
- No. 1-ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking **Preston Stout** (T15/-14) cards a final round 2-under 69 highlighted by an eagle on the par-5 No. 2, his best finish on TOUR in four starts
