Today – A couple of showers and isolated thunderstorm to the southwest may move into the Quad-Cities area between 7-8am. Otherwise, the bulk of the morning will be dry before thunderstorms across Central Iowa moves across the area between 12pm-3pm. Storms could be strong with gusty wind and heavy rainfall. There will likely be a lull in the storm activity during the late afternoon into the evening before storms redevelop across Central Iowa tonight.

Extended forecast– Another thunderstorm complex will move across the area early Saturday morning that could have an impact on the start of play. There will likely be a lull in the activity for a good portion of the day before additional thunderstorms redevelop during the late afternoon and early evening hours with the heating of the day. Storms could be strong to severe with damaging wind and very heavy rainfall. Sunday should be a less active day as the front slips south of the area. However, a pop-up shower or thunderstorm remains possible during the afternoon as upper-level energy remains close by.
