Weather: Mostly sunny. High of 80. Wind ENE 3-6 mph.

Cut: 54 professionals at 4-over 148 from a field of 85 professionals and six amateurs; 16 strokes between leader (-12) and cutline (+4) ties second-most in Masters history (19 strokes/1976/131-150, 16 strokes/2015/130-146)

Rory McIlroy (1st/-12)

- Makes nine birdies, including six in his last seven holes, en route to a 7-under 65, the low round of the tournament through 36 holes
- Nine birdies marks his most in a single round at the Masters (7 twice, R1/2011, R4/2016) and his most in a single round of a major championship (8 birdies, R1/2014 PGA Championship)
- Becomes fourth Masters champion to hold the 36-hole lead/co-lead the year after victory: Arnold Palmer (1959, 1961, 1965), Ian Woosnam (1992), Jordan Spieth (2016)
- Six-stroke lead marks the largest 36-hole margin in Masters Tournament history
- 12th career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (6-of-11 to date) and first since the 2023 Genesis Scottish Open (Won); four second-round leaders/co-leaders have won on TOUR this season
- Seeks 30th PGA TOUR victory and with a win would tie Horton Smith (16th all time)
- Making 18th start at the Masters Tournament following his win in 2025, one of eight top-10 results at Augusta National
- Looks to join Jack Nicklaus (1956, 1965), Nick Faldo (1989, 1990) and Tiger Woods (2001, 2002) as players to successfully defend their title at the Masters Tournament
- Best finish in four starts this season: T2/The Genesis Invitational

Patrick Reed (T2/-6)

- 2018 victory at the Masters Tournament is one of five top-10 finishes in 12 appearances at Augusta National
- Making first PGA TOUR start this season, nine-time PGA TOUR winner recorded two DP World Tour wins in 2026 (Hero Dubai Desert Classic, Qatar Masters)
- Opens with a pair of sub-70 rounds at the Masters Tournament for the third time in his career (2018/69-66/Won, 2021/68-68/T10); shot 69-69 in rounds three and four at the 2025 Masters Tournament to finish third, the only time he has posted two sub-70 rounds on the weekend at the Masters
- Joins leader Rory McIlroy as the two players in the field with two rounds in the 60s

Miscellaneous Notes

- First-round co-leader **Sam Burns** (T2/-6) birdies three of his last four holes en route to a 1-under 71; seeks first major championship title; owns two top-10 results in 22 prior major championship starts (T7/2025 U.S. Open, T9/2024 U.S. Open)
- **Justin Rose** (T4/-5) posts 3-under 69, his 18th sub-70 round at the Masters, but his first in round two (21 appearances)
- With 70-69, **Shane Lowry** (T4/-5) opens with back-to-back under-par rounds for the second time in his 11th appearance (other time: 2025/71-68); best Masters finish: T3/2022
- 2025 FedExCup champion **Tommy Fleetwood** (T4/-5) owns one top-10 result in nine prior appearances at the Masters (T3/2024); four top-10s in five starts this season (T4/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T7/The Genesis Invitational, T8/THE PLAYERS Championship, T10/Valero Texas Open)
- For the first time in his 142 major championship rounds, **Tyrrell Hatton** (T7/-4) hit all 18 greens in regulation; joins Jim Furyk (2009/R1/66) and Kevin Na (2020/R1/73) as the only players to achieve this feat in the last 30 years at the Masters
- Norway's **Kristoffer Reitan** (T7/-4) is the best of the 22 first-time competitors, eight of whom made the cut: **Chris Gotterup** (T7/-3), **Ben Griffin** (T7/-3), **Michael Brennan** (T20/-1), **Ryan Gerard** (T24/E), **Jacob Bridgeman** (T32/+1) **Marco Penge** (T32/+1), **Sam Stevens** (T39/+2)

- **Brooks Koepka** (T13/-3) owns two runner-up results at Augusta National (T2/2019, T2/2023); with a victory at the Masters Tournament, the five-time major champion (PGA Championship/2018, 2019, 2023, U.S. Open/2017, 2018) would join three active players (Scottie Scheffler, Jordan Spieth, Phil Mickelson) with three legs of the career Grand Slam
- 2021 Masters champion **Hideki Matsuyama** (T16/-2), the only male major championship winner from Japan, has made 14 cuts in 15 appearances at the Masters Tournament (MC/2014)
- **Scottie Scheffler's** (T24/E) streak of 11 consecutive rounds of par-or-better at the Masters Tournament was snapped with a second-round 74; only two players have a longer streak of par-or-better rounds in Masters history: Tiger Woods (16), Jon Rahm (15)
- 10 of the 18 past Masters champions in the field made the cut: **Rory McIlroy** (1st/-12), **Patrick Reed** (T2/-6), **Hideki Matsuyama** (T16/-2), **Scottie Scheffler** (T24/E), **Dustin Johnson** (T24/E), **Jordan Spieth** (T32/+1), **Adam Scott** (T39/+2), **Sergio Garcia** (T45/+3), **Jon Rahm** (T47/+4), **Charl Schwartzel** (T47/+4)
- For the second consecutive year, no amateurs made the cut
