**Aaron Rai (1st/-10)**

- Follows opening-round 65 with a 4-under 67 and holds a one-stroke lead over Brandt Snedeker and Mark Hubbard through 36-holes
- Matches largest 36-hole lead in tournament history (1/Chris Gotterup/2024)
- Holds fourth 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recent: 2024 John Deere Classic/finished T7); 0-for-3 to date
- Making tournament debut, Englishman is the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 42 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Leads the field in birdies (15); tied his most birdies in a single round on TOUR in the first round with nine
- Has two top-25 finishes in eight starts this season (best: T23/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches)
- Has one win in 121 PGA TOUR starts (2024 Wyndham Championship)
- Finished No. 58 in the 2025 FedExCup Fall standings after qualifying for the FedExCup Playoffs for the fourth consecutive year

**Miscellaneous Notes**

- 2026 Presidents Cup U.S. Team Captain, **Brandt Snedeker** (T2/-9) cards a bogey-free 5-under 66 to match the low-round of the day; his most recent of nine PGA TOUR victories came at the 2018 Wyndham Championship
- Making his 274 PGA TOUR start, **Mark Hubbard** (T2/-9) holds the second-most starts among active players on the PGA TOUR without a win on record (most: 325/Patrick Rodgers/not in the field this week); has failed to make birdie or better on the par-5s through 36-holes, but has played the par-3s 5-under (six birdies, one bogey)
- **Kevin Roy** and **Christiaan Bezuidenhout**, both T4 at 8-under, trail by two in bid for their first PGA TOUR victory; both ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic winners recorded their first TOUR win at the event (Chris Gotterup/2024, Ryan Fox/2025)
- **Peter Malnati** (T8/-6) is the only player bogey-free thru 36-holes; making second start at the event (MC/2025)
- Making 21<sup>st</sup> start on TOUR and first since the 2022 Shriners Children’s Open (MC), **Ryan Ruffels** (T15/-5) makes first cut since the 2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (finished T34); winner of The Q at Myrtle Beach, a high-stakes YouTube showdown where YouTube golf content creators competed for a sponsor exemption into the field this week
- Making his 195<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start, nine-time winner **Brooks Koepka** (T22/-4) sits six strokes back of the lead
- Making his third start at the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic (T26/2024, T37/2025), 18-year-old **Blades Brown** (T22/-4) has earned 169 non-member FedExCup points this season and is 86 points short of the threshold for Special Temporary Membership and he can become eligible for STM this week with a two-way T3 finish or better
- 18-hole leader **Martin Laird** (T30/-3) follows 64 with a 75; marks second made cut in as many starts this season (T57/Puerto Rico Open)
- Open qualifier and amateur, **Connor Doyal** (T65/E) makes the cut on the number in his second start on TOUR (MC/2025 Corales Puntacana Championship)
