Ben James (1st/-10)

- 23-year-old making his professional debut after finishing as the No. 1 player in the 2026 PGA TOUR University Ranking
- Records a career-best 18-hole score with a bogey-free 7-under 63, his first bogey-free round in his 24th round on TOUR (previous best: 67/R1/2026 RBC Canadian Open)
- Holds first lead after any round on TOUR (previous best 36-hole position: T13/2025 Valero Texas Open)
- Has two made cuts in nine prior starts as an amateur (T44/2024 Rocket Classic, T33/2025 Valero Texas Open)
- Joins Ludvig Aberg (2023), Michael Thorbjornsen (2024), and David Ford (2025) as the fourth player to earn TOUR membership as the No. 1 player from PGA TOUR University
- Finished his college career at Virginia (2022-26) with seven victories, tying Ben Kohles' school record for career wins
- Led the Cavaliers to the program's first two ACC Championships (2025, 2026) and a national runner-up finish in 2025
- Became the fifth player in NCAA Division I history to win First Team All-America honors four times and first since Bryce Molder (1998-2001)

Additional notes

- 18-hole co-leader **Sam Burns** (T2/-9) seeks to become the second player this season to finish runner-up and win the same tournament the next year (Gary Woodland, 2025-26 Texas Children's Houston Open) after finishing runner-up in the 2025 RBC Canadian Open (defeated by Ryan Fox on the fourth playoff hole); has not recorded a score worse than 68 in six career rounds at TPC Toronto
- Five players are tied at 9-under, one shot off the lead, including three players seeking their first PGA TOUR title: **Jackson Suber** (41 starts), **Haotong Li** (64 starts), **Jesper Svensson** (39 starts)
- First-year member **Haotong Li** (T2/-9) matches his low-round of the season with a 6-under 64 (The American Express/R3/finished T8); the four-time winner on the DP World Tour earned PGA TOUR membership by finishing inside the top 10 of the DP World Tour's 2025 Race to Dubai
- Defending champion **Ryan Fox** (T7/-8) seeks to become the second player on TOUR this season to defend their title (Rory McIlroy/Masters Tournament) and fifth player since 1950 to successfully defend RBC Canadian Open title (Rory McIlroy/2022, Jhonattan Vegas/2017, Jim Furyk/2007, Jim Ferrier/1951)
- 36-hole scores of notable players in the field:
 - Nine-time PGA TOUR winner **Brooks Koepka** (T7/-8)
 - 2025 FedExCup winner **Tommy Fleetwood** (T7/-8)
 - 2024 RBC Canadian Open winner **Robert MacIntyre** (T19/-6)
 - Seven-time PGA TOUR winner **Collin Morikawa** (T28/-5)
 - **Matt Fitzpatrick** (T28/-5), the highest-ranked player in the field (OWGR No. 4)
- 10 of the 21 Canadian players made the cut, the most in tournament history since 1970 (previous: 8, 2023/2024/2025)
 - Canadian players that made the cut: **Matthew Anderson** (T13/-7), **Taylor Pendrith** (T13/-7), **Sudarshan Yellamaraju** (T28/-5), **Adam Hadwin** (T46/-3), **Justin Matthews** (T46/-3), **Ben Silverman** (T46/-3), **Adam Svensson** (T46/-3), **A.J. Ewart** (T46/-3), **Nick Taylor** (T61/-2), **Joey Savoie** (T61/-2)
- **David Lipsky** (MC) aces the 119-yard par-3 14th, his first career hole-in-one on TOUR in his 153rd start; marked the second ace recorded at TPC Toronto at Osprey Valley this week (Christiaan Bezuidenhout/R1/No. 7)
