Jackson Suber (1st/-13)

- Earns first career lead after any round on the PGA TOUR in his 42nd start (119 total rounds on TOUR)
- Best 54-hole position prior to this week: T7 (two times), 2025 Barracuda Championship (finished 7th), 2025 Rocket Classic (T6)
- Has made birdie on every par-5 this week (6/6 on Nos. 1 and 18); second time in his TOUR career with birdies on all par-5s through 54 holes (2025 Sony Open in Hawaii, finished T6)
- Leads the field through three rounds in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (11.133)
- Ranks third this week in both Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (4.282) and Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (4.856)
- Marks a career low 54-hole score on TOUR of 197 (66-65-66); previous best was 198 (2026 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/finished 4th)
- Second-year member seeking his first PGA TOUR title in his 42nd career start
- Entered the week No. 107 in the FedExCup standings
- In 11 starts on TOUR this season, owns six made cuts and two top-25 finishes, including a career-best 4th at the CJ CUP Byron Nelson (other top-25: T19, ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
- In his 2025 rookie campaign, finished the year No. 124 in the FedExCup Fall standings after recording six top-25 finishes and three top-10s in 27 starts; best finish last season was T6 (two times) at the Sony Open in Hawaii and Rocket Classic
- Earned PGA TOUR membership for the first time after finishing No. 20 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- Played collegiately at the University of Mississippi (2018-22), amassing five career wins, earning 2022 All-America Second Team recognition as a senior, and garnering back-to-back All-Southeastern Conference First Team honors as a junior and senior

Bud Cauley (2nd/-12)

- First time inside the top five of the leaderboard entering the final round since the 2025 PLAYERS Championship (2nd/finished T6)
- 54-hole score of 198 (69-63-66) is one shy of tying his career best (197 - 2016 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/finished T4, 2012 Wyndham Championship/3rd)
- Seeking his first PGA TOUR title in his 239th career start
- No. 55 in the FedExCup standings; in 14 starts on TOUR this season, owns five top-25 finishes (best: 7th, RBC Heritage)

Wyndham Clark (T3/-11)

- Cards the low round of the day with a bogey-free 63, his best score in seven career rounds at TPC Toronto at Osprey Valley
- In his last 11 rounds on TOUR, he has recorded a score of 68 or better 10 times, including three rounds of 63 or better
- Enters the week coming off back-to-back top-three finishes in his last two starts: 3rd/Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, Won/CJ CUP Byron Nelson
- Marks his third consecutive start playing the final round in the last or next to last grouping

Additional notes

- **Brice Garnett** (T3/-11) sits inside the top three on the leaderboard after 54 holes for the fourth time in his career (294 starts) and the first time since the 2024 Puerto Rico Open (sat T2 entering final round and won in a playoff); in 13 starts this season, has three top-25 finishes, highlighted by a T19 at the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic
- **Tommy Fleetwood** (T3/-11) records his third-consecutive round this week of 3-under or better and enters the final round two back; in all four of his starts in the RBC Canadian Open, he has sat inside the top 15 of the leaderboard after 54 holes each year (2024/T5/finished T21, 2023/T2/finished 2nd, 2018/T14/finished T6)

- With rounds of 66-65-68, **Jesper Svensson** (T3/-11) records his best 54-hole score of the season with 199, one shy of his career best (198, 2025 3M Open, finished T14); second-year member seeks his first win on TOUR in his 40th start
- **Billy Horschel** (T7/-10) cards two eagles (par-5 first and par-4 eighth) en route to a 6-under 64, tied for his low round of the season (The American Express/R1)
- Of the 10 Canadian players to make the cut, **Sudarshan Yellamaraju** (T7/-10) is the highest on the leaderboard after 54 holes; PGA TOUR rookie ranks second this week in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (5.257); has played the six par-5 holes (Nos. 1 and 18) in 7-under this week, including an eagle on No. 1 to open the third round
- Following back-to-back 66s, defending champion **Ryan Fox** (T7/-10) cards a third-round 68 as he seeks to become the fifth player since 1950 to successfully defend at the RBC Canadian Open (Rory McIlroy/2022, Jhonattan Vegas/2017, Jim Furyk/2007, Jim Ferrier/1951)
- 36-hole leader **Ben James** (T59/-2), making his professional debut this week, cards an 8-over 78 after opening the week with rounds of 67 and 63
- Five of the last six winners of the RBC Canadian Open entered the final round with at least a share of the 54-hole lead: Ryan Fox/2025, Robert MacIntyre/2024, Rory McIlroy/2022, Rory McIlroy/2019, Dustin Johnson/2018 (tournament not contested in 2020 or 2021)
- In the last six PGA TOUR events, only one player who held the 54-hole lead/co-lead has gone on to win (J.T. Poston at last week's Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
