Bud Cauley (Winner/-17)

- Earns first PGA TOUR victory in 239th career start at the age 36 years, 2 months, 29 days
 - Previous best finish on TOUR: 3rd, four times, most recently: 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Becomes 18th first-time winner at the tournament and first since Robert MacIntyre in 2024
- Becomes first American to earn their first career win at this event since Chez Reavie in 2008
- Becomes fifth first-time winner on TOUR this season and first since Kristoffer Reitan (Truist Championship)
- Last five players to earn first win after 235 starts on TOUR:
 - Bud Cauley/2026 RBC Canadian Open/239
 - Adam Schenk/2025 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/243
 - Chris Stroud/2017 Barracuda Championship/290
 - Greg Chalmers/2016 Barracuda Championship/386
 - Alex Cejka/2015 Puerto Rico Open/287
- Two-stroke victory marks largest at the RBC Canadian Open since Rory McIlroy in 2022 (won by 2 strokes)
- Victory marks second top-five in seven starts at the RBC Canadian Open (T4/2012)
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and moves from No. 55 to No. 28 in the FedExCup standings
- Move to No. 40 in the Official World Golf Ranking and qualifies for next week's U.S. Open via the top 60 players in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Win marks second top-10 in his 15th start this season (7th/RBC Heritage)

Additional notes

- With a final-round 6-under 64, **Matt Fitzpatrick** (2nd/-15), the highest-ranked player in the field (OWGR No. 4) earns his fifth runner-up finish and second this season (THE PLAYERS Championship); was seeking to become the first player since Scottie Scheffler (6/2025) to earn four or more PGA TOUR wins in a season (three wins: Zurich Classic of New Orleans, RBC Heritage, Valspar Championship)
- Making his Canadian Open debut, Norway's **Viktor Hovland** (3rd/-14) finishes solo-third, his best finish since the 2025 U.S. Open (3rd)
- Three qualifying spots were available for The 154th Open at Royal Birkdale (July 16-19) through the Open Qualifying Series; the leading three finishers, not otherwise exempt, from the RBC Canadian Open earned spots in the field: **Bud Cauley** (Won), **Jesper Svensson** (T4), **Jackson Suber** (T4)
- Defending champion **Ryan Fox** (T8/-12) finishes T8 in first title defense; was seeking to become the fifth player since 1950 to successfully defend at the RBC Canadian Open (Rory McIlroy/2022, Jhonattan Vegas/2017, Jim Furyk/2007, Jim Ferrier/1951)
- PGA TOUR rookie who plays from Ontario, Canada **Sudarshan Yellamaraju** (T8/-12) claims the Rivermead Cup as low Canadian; records third top-10 in 17 starts this season
- Making his third start at the RBC Canadian Open, 22-year-old **Justin Matthews** (T29/-8) wins the Gary Cowan Medal as low amateur
- In his first start as a PGA TOUR member and as a professional, **Ben James** posted rounds of 67-63-78-69 to finish T54
- Nine-time PGA TOUR winner **Brooks Koepka** (hand injury) withdrew prior to the start of the final round

- The top five players, not otherwise exempt, who earned the most FedExCup points in the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, Charles Schwab Challenge and RBC Canadian Open have qualified for the Travelers Championship via the Aon Swing 5 (**bold** = in the field):
