Davis Riley (1st/-15)

- Earns his fourth career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and second of the season: 2026 Sony Open in Hawaii (finished T6), 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge (Won), 2022 Valspar Championship (finished 2nd)
- Hit 17-of-18 greens en route to bogey-free 63, his second consecutive day bogey free; one stroke shy of tying his career-low 62 from the 2022 Valspar Championship (R3)
- 54-hole score of 195 ties his career best in individual stroke play (2022 Valspar Championship)
- Ranks third this week in Strokes Gained: Putting (6.671)
- In 20 starts this season, owns 10 made cuts and two top-25 finishes (best: T6/Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Entered the week No. 146 in the FedExCup standings and projected to climb to No. 61 with a win
- Two PGA TOUR wins: 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge, 2023 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with teammate Nick Hardy)

Michael Brennan (2nd/-14)

- Opened the third round with four birdies in his first five holes; sat 7-under through 17 holes before recording his lone bogey of the day on the par-4 18th
- Ranks second this week in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (6.859) and fourth in Strokes Gained: Putting (6.447)
- Seeks his second PGA TOUR title in his 28th career start on TOUR
- Won the 2025 Bank of Utah Championship as a sponsor exemption in his third PGA TOUR start, becoming the seventh player on record to earn his first PGA TOUR title within his first three career starts
- In 21 starts on TOUR this season, owns three top-25 finishes and one top-10 (T6/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Entered the week No. 106 in the FedExCup standings
- Finished No. 12 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking after four seasons at Wake Forest University (2020-24), where he earned eight individual victories, tied for third most in program history at the time
- Finished No. 1 on the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas points list with three wins, among 12 top-10 finishes, in 16 starts

Additional notes

- After making the cut on the number, Denmark's **Rasmus Højgaard** (T3/-12) cards the low round of the day with a bogey-free 61, marking a new career low in his 183rd round on TOUR (previous: 63, 2024 Genesis Scottish Open/R2); led the field in the third round in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (3.555) and ranked second in Strokes Gained: Putting (3.788); marks his second-best 54-hole position in 59 career PGA TOUR starts (best: T2/2025 WM Phoenix Open/finished T12)
- Making his seventh start at the Rocket Classic after finishing runner-up last year, six-time PGA TOUR winner **Chris Kirk** (T3/-12) seeks to become the second player this season (Gary Woodland/Texas Children's Houston Open) to win a tournament after finishing runner-up in the same event last year
- 2023 Rocket Classic winner **Rickie Fowler** (T3/-12) seeks to join Cam Davis (2021, 2024) as the only players with multiple wins in the Rocket Classic; sits inside the top three on the leaderboard entering the final round for the first time since the

2025 Charles Schwab Challenge (solo-third after 54 holes, finished T16); 54-hole score of 198 is his lowest this season (previous: 201, The American Express, finished T18)

- **Cameron Young** (T3/-12) is seeking his fourth PGA TOUR victory in his 114th career start; highest-ranked player in the field owns two wins this season (THE PLAYERS Championship, Cadillac Championship) and seeks to join Matt Fitzpatrick and Chris Gotterup as the only players with three titles this year
- 36-hole co-leader **Patrick Cantlay** (T11/-10) enters the final round five back after a third-round 70; eight-time PGA TOUR winner seeks his first win since the 2022 BMW Championship; ranked inside the top 15 in Strokes Gained: Putting in each of the first two rounds, but ranked 67th among 73 players in the third round (-2.502)
