Davis Riley (T1/-9)

- Matches the low round of the day with 6-under 64 (Ryan Gerard/T10)
- 29-year-old seeks his third win on TOUR in his 131st start (2023 Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with partner Nick Hardy; 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Second 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (1-for-1 to date); 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Third appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (T20/2022, MC/2024)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (8.764) and birdies (14)

S.H. Kim (T1/-9)

- 27-year-old seeks his first win on TOUR in his 75th start (best finish: 2nd/2023 Fortinet Championship)
- Looks to become the 10th player to make the Sony Open in Hawaii his first win on TOUR (most recent: Russell Henley/2013)
- Second 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (0-for-1 to date); finished 2nd at the 2023 Fortinet Championship
- Matches his low 36-hole score on TOUR (previous instance: 2021 CJ CUP @ SUMMIT)
- Third appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (T12/2023, T30/2024)
- Looks to become the 10th different winner (26th win) by a player from South Korea on TOUR; most recent: Tom Kim (2023 Shriners Children's Open)
- Looks to become the third player from South Korea to win the Sony Open in Hawaii (K.J. Choi/2008, Si Woo Kim/2023)

Adrien Dumont de Chassart (T1/-9)

- 25-year-old seeks his first win on TOUR in his 33rd start (best finish: T3/2024 Butterfield Bermuda Championship)
- Looks to become the 10th player to make the Sony Open in Hawaii his first win on TOUR (most recent: Russell Henley/2013)
- First 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (previous best 36-hole position: T6/2024 RSM Classic/finished T25)
- Records his low 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 134/three times; most recent: 2024 RSM Classic/finished T25)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (3.874)
- Second appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (MC/2024)
- Looks to become the 13th international winner of the Sony Open in Hawaii and first from Belgium
- Looks to earn the second win on TOUR by a player from Belgium (Thomas Detry/2025 WM Phoenix Open)

Nick Taylor (T1/-9)

- 37-year-old seeks his sixth win on TOUR in his 307th start (2014 Sanderson Farms Championship, 2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2023 RBC Canadian Open, 2024 WM Phoenix Open, 2025 Sony Open in Hawaii)

- Fourth 36-hole lead/co-lead (1-for-3 to date); 2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; held the 36-hole lead at the 2021 Sony Open in Hawaii (finished T11)
- Looks to become the event's first back-to-back champion since Jimmy Walker (2015)
- Looks to accomplish the first successful title defense on TOUR since Scottie Scheffler (2025 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Making his 10th start at the Sony Open in Hawaii, with four straight finishes of T11 or better (T11/2021, T7/2023, T7/2024, 1st/2025)
- Looks to earn the 42nd win on TOUR by a player from Canada; his win at the 2025 Sony Open in Hawaii is the most recent win by a Canadian; would remain third on Canada's all-time wins list (Mike Weir/8, George Knudson/8)
- Now has 18 consecutive par-or-better rounds at Waialae Country Club (69-under during that stretch), including 13 straight rounds in the 60s

Kevin Roy (T1/-9)

- 35-year-old seeks his first win on TOUR in his 62nd start (best finish: T3/2025 John Deere Classic)
- First 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (previous best 36-hole position: T5/2023 John Deere Classic/finished T31)
- Records his low 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 132/two times; most recent: 2025 John Deere Classic/finished T3)
- Looks to become the 10th player to make the Sony Open in Hawaii his first win on TOUR (most recent: Russell Henley/2013)
- Third appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (MC/2023, T45/2025)

Miscellaneous Notes

- The five-way tie marks the most players tied for the lead after 36 holes on TOUR since the 2024 Valspar Championship (5)
- Rookie **John Parry** (T6/-8) looks to become the first player to win in his first start as a TOUR member since Emiliano Grillo (2015 Frys.com Open) and first rookie winner since Michael Brennan (2025 Bank of Utah Championship)
- 62-year-old World Golf Hall of Fame member **Vijay Singh** (T47/-2) makes his first cut in a non-major on TOUR since the 2020 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday; with his 507th made cut on TOUR, passes Stewart Cink for the sixth-most cuts made since 1983; becomes the oldest player to make a cut on TOUR since Fred Couples (2023 Masters Tournament/63 years, 6 months, 5 days); becomes the oldest player since 1983 to make the cut at the Sony Open in Hawaii, passing Fred Funk (2017/60 years, 7 months, 1 day); 2005 Sony Open in Hawaii champion is making his 25th appearance at the event
- **Yuta Suguira** (illness) withdrew during the second round

Aon Swing 5

- The Sony Open in Hawaii, the first event of the 2026 PGA TOUR Season, is the first opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5 with entry into each of the next two Signature Events (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational); the top five players, not otherwise exempt, who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express, Farmers Insurance Open and the WM Phoenix Open will qualify for those two events
