Davis Riley (1st/-12)

- 29-year-old seeks his third win on TOUR in his 131st start (2023 Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with partner Nick Hardy; 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Third 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (1-for-2 to date); 2022 Valspar Championship (2nd), 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge (1st)
- Third appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (T20/2022, MC/2024)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (11.564) and birdies (20)

Harry Hall (T2/-10)

- 28-year-old seeks his second win on TOUR in his 90th start (2024 ISCO Championship)
- One of the 14 players in the field who advanced to the 2025 TOUR Championship, finishing No. 17 in the FedExCup standings
- Fourth appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (T28/2023, T42/2024, T10/2025); shared the 18-hole lead with five other players in 2025 before finishing T10
- Has shot par-or-better in all 15 rounds at Waialae Country Club, including 13 rounds in the 60s
- Leads the field this week in Scrambling (11 of 13)
- Would become the first player from England to win the Sony Open in Hawaii

Chris Gotterup (T2/-10)

- 26-year-old seeks his third win on TOUR in his 69th start (2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, 2025 Genesis Scottish Open)
- One of the 14 players in the field who advanced to the 2025 TOUR Championship, finishing No. 10 in the FedExCup standings
- Second appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (MC/2025)

Kevin Roy (T2/-10)

- 35-year-old seeks his first win on TOUR in his 62nd start (best finish: T3/2025 John Deere Classic)
- Equals low 54-hole score on TOUR (200/third time; previous instances: 2023 John Deere Classic/finished T31, 2025 RBC Canadian Open/finished T18)
- Looks to become the 10th player to make the Sony Open in Hawaii his first win on TOUR (most recent: Russell Henley/2013)
- Third appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (MC/2023, T45/2025)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (4.648)

Miscellaneous Notes

- 2025 Barracuda Championship winner **Ryan Gerard** (T5/-9) qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in 2025 in his first full season as a PGA TOUR member, finishing No. 39 in the standings; in his only other Sony Open in Hawaii start, entered

the final round last season trailing 54-hole leader J.J. Spaun by three strokes, eventually finishing T37 following a 2-over 72

- Rookie **John Parry** (T5/-9) looks to become the first player to win in his first start as a TOUR member since Emiliano Grillo (2015 Frys.com Open) and first rookie winner since Michael Brennan (2025 Bank of Utah Championship)
- **Nick Taylor** (T5/-9) posts an even-par 70, his 19th straight par-or-better round at Waialae Country Club; streak of 13 straight rounds in the 60s comes to an end
 - Seeks to become the first back-to-back Sony Open in Hawaii champion since Jimmy Walker (2015)
 - Would become the sixth multiple winner of the event, joining Hubert Green (1978, 1979), Corey Pavin (1986, 1987), Lanny Wadkins (1988, 1991), Ernie Els (2003, 2004) and Walker (2014, 2015)
- **Patrick Rodgers** (T8/-8) has the most starts on TOUR without a win (since 1983 and among active players entering the week): 312 (*Rodgers*), 262 (Mark Hubbard), 233 (Beau Hossler)

Aon Swing 5

- The Sony Open in Hawaii, the first event of the 2026 PGA TOUR Season, is the first opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5 with entry into each of the next two Signature Events (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational); the top five players, not otherwise exempt, who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express, Farmers Insurance Open and the WM Phoenix Open will qualify for those two events
