**Weather:** Partly cloudy with intermittent showers and breezy. High of 79. Winds E at 9-14 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

#### Chris Gotterup (1<sup>st</sup>/-16)

- Earns his third win on TOUR in his 69<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 26 years, 5 months, 29 days (previous wins: 2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, 2025 Genesis Scottish Open); second win in his last eight starts on TOUR after earning one win in his first 61 starts
- First player since Tom Kim (2023 Shriners Children's Open/44<sup>th</sup> start) to earn first three PGA TOUR wins in less than 70 starts
- Matches his low final-round score on TOUR (64); previous instance: 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/finished T15
- First win when trailing entering the final round on TOUR (54-hole positions of wins: led at the 2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, was T1 at the 2025 Genesis Scottish Open, was T2 at the 2026 Sony Open Hawaii)
- Sixth player in the last seven years to come from behind after trailing entering the final round to win the Sony Open in Hawaii; trailed 54-hole leader Davis Riley by two strokes
- Two-stroke win is the largest margin of victory at the Sony Open in Hawaii since 2019 (Matt Kuchar/four strokes)
- Victory comes in his second appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii (MC/2025)
- Fully exempt on TOUR through 2028
- Earns 500 FedExCup points to become the first FedExCup leader of the 2026 season
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (4.352); T1 in sand saves (6-of-6)

#### Miscellaneous Notes

- **Ryan Gerard** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-14) closes with 65, his lowest final-round score on TOUR (previous: 66/2025 FedEx St. Jude Championship); matches his low 72-hole score in an individual stroke play event on TOUR (2025 Texas Children's Houston Open/finished 9<sup>th</sup>); notches his third top-two finish on TOUR in his 54<sup>th</sup> start (previous instances: 1<sup>st</sup>/2025 Barracuda Championship, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2025 Valero Texas Open)
- **Patrick Rodgers** (3<sup>rd</sup>/-13) earns his 31<sup>st</sup> top-10 finish in his 313<sup>th</sup> start, the most top-10 finishes on TOUR without a win among active players (since 1983); owns the most starts on TOUR without a win among active players (since 1983)
- **Robert MacIntyre** (T4/-12) cards the low round of the day (63); earns his third top-three finish in his last nine starts on TOUR (previous instances: 2<sup>nd</sup>/2025 U.S. Open, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2025 BMW Championship)
- 54-hole leader **Davis Riley** (T6/-11) posts 1-over 71, playing Nos. 6-8 in 4-over including a double bogey on the eighth hole; falls to 1-for-3 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on TOUR (2022 Valspar Championship/2<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge/1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 Sony Open in Hawaii/T6)
- Starting the day three strokes back, defending champion **Nick Taylor** (T13/-9) closes with even-par 70; earns his fifth consecutive top-15 finish at the Sony Open in Hawaii (T11/2021, T7/2023, T7/2024, 1st/2025, T13/2026); records his 20th consecutive round of par or better at Waialae Country Club

#### Aon Swing 5

- The Sony Open in Hawaii, the first event of the 2026 PGA TOUR Season, was the first opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5 with entry into each of the next two Signature Events (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-

Am, The Genesis Invitational); the top five players, not otherwise exempt, who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express, Farmers Insurance Open and the WM Phoenix Open will qualify for those two events
