**Weather:** Cloudy. High of 83. Winds SSW at 4-8 mph. Preferred lies were in effect for the second round. Due to forecasted inclement weather, third-round tee times will be off Nos. 1 and 10 tees from approximately 9:30-11:30 a.m. CT in groups of three

**36-hole cut:** 70 professionals at 6-under 136 from a field of 143 professionals and four amateurs

**Si Woo Kim (1<sup>st</sup>/-18)**

- Making his sixth start at THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, South Korea native and Dallas resident follows first-round 64 with an 11-under 60, including a final-hole bogey while attempting to become the 15<sup>th</sup> different player to shoot sub-60 on the PGA TOUR
- Holds the lead/co-lead for the fourth time in individual stroke-play events on TOUR; 1-for-3 to date: 2016 Wyndham Championship/Won, 2019 Valero Texas Open/T4, 2020 Wyndham Championship/T3
- Equals his low round on TOUR (R2/2016 Wyndham Championship/Won) and joins Blades Brown (R2/Nicklaus Tournament Course) and Andrew Putnam (R2/La Quinta CC), who both shot 60 at The American Express, with the lowest round on TOUR this season
- 124 marks his best 36-hole total on TOUR by four strokes (previous: 128/2026 American Express/T6, 128/2016 Wyndham Championship/Won) and ties the tournament 36-hole scoring record (Scottie Scheffler/2025)
- Five stroke margin is one shy of the 36-hole tournament record (6/Scottie Scheffler/2025)
- Four-time PGA TOUR winner seeks first title since 2023 Sony Open in Hawaii; also won 2016 Wyndham Championship, 2017 PLAYERS Championship, 2021 American Express
- Now owns 19 consecutive made cuts on TOUR; last missed cut: 2025 Wyndham Championship
- Entering this week, led all players with the most birdies on TOUR since 2016 (3,776)
- Notched six top-10 finishes in 14 starts this season with T2 at Farmers Insurance Open his best result
- Has three consecutive top-15 finishes at TPC Craig Ranch (T2/2023, T13/2024, T15/2025), tied for longest active streak of any player at this course with World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler

**Miscellaneous Notes**

- CJ ambassador **Sungjae Im** (T2/-13) cards 10-under 61, his low round on TOUR (752 rounds); plays his final three holes in 4-under, including an ace at No. 7, holing a 5-iron from 224 yards; marks his third hole-in-one on TOUR (2019 Greenbrier Classic, 2019 PLAYERS Championship); first player to make an eagle on both a par-3 and a par-5 hole in the same round on TOUR since Mark Hubbard (2025 Corales Puntacana Championship/R1)
- 25-year-old PGA TOUR rookie **Kensei Hirata** (T2/-13) follows an opening-round 64 with a bogey-free 65 for a 13-under 129 total, his best 36-hole total on TOUR; six-time winner on the Japan Golf Tour, including four victories in 2024
- 2025 THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson winner and Dallas resident **Scottie Scheffler** (T2/-13) is one of two players bogey-free through 36 holes (Jackson Suber); is seeking to become the first player since Tiger Woods to successfully defend their title after winning by eight strokes the year prior (2007 WGC-Workday Championship at The Concession); the 20-time PGA TOUR winner has successfully defended his title three times on TOUR (2023 WM Phoenix Open, 2024 THE PLAYERS Championship, 2025 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- In his 201<sup>st</sup> PGA TOUR start, 2023 U.S. Open champion **Wyndham Clark** (T2/-13) seeks his first top-10 this season; last top-10 was T4 at last year's Open Championship; T13 at The American Express marks his best result in 12 starts this season
- **Jackson Suber** (T2/-13) cards 10-under 61 to be one of six players to record 62 or better in round two (60/Si Woo Kim, 61/Sungjae Im, Jackson Suber, 62/Jordan Spieth, Max Greyserman, Tom Hoge); most recently, the second round of the 2025 RSM Classic featured six scores of 62 or better

- Making his 14th appearance at THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, Dallas native and resident **Jordan Spieth** (T7/-12) seeks to improve on his runner-up finish in 2022 and win for the first time; has made 14 starts in two tournaments on TOUR where he has yet to win (Genesis Invitational, PGA Championship); follows a first-round 68 with a 9-under 62 that includes six consecutive birdies on hole Nos. 1-6; the six-hole birdie streak matches his most consecutive birdies in a round on TOUR (2020 RBC Heritage/R1); 62 equals his low round at THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson (R4/2025)
- **Blades Brown** (T38/-8) is 42.553 points short of the threshold for Special Temporary Membership of the PGA TOUR, which he can reach with a solo 21<sup>st</sup> this week; earned a spot in the field this week via his top-10 finish at the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic (T9)
- **Cameron Champ** withdrew before the second round
