Playoff:

- 11th playoff in Memorial Tournament history and first since 2023 (Viktor Hovland def. Denny McCarthy)
- Fifth playoff on TOUR this season (WM Phoenix Open/Chris Gotterup def. Hideki Matsuyama, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard/Akshay Bhatia def. Daniel Berger, RBC Heritage/Matt Fitzpatrick def. Scottie Scheffler, Charles Schwab Challenge/Russell Henley def. Eric Cole)
- Updated PGA TOUR playoff records:
 - J.T. Poston: 1-1
 - Ryan Gerard: 0-1

J.T. Poston (P1/-12)

- Fourth career PGA TOUR victory in his 257th start at the age of 33 years, 6 days
- PGA TOUR wins (4): 2019 Wyndham Championship, 2022 John Deere Classic, 2024 Shriners Children’s Open, 2026 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- Even-par 72 in the final round included birdies on three of his final five holes (Nos. 14, 15 and 18)
- Moves to No. 32 in the FedExCup; entered the week without a finish inside the top 20 in 13 starts this season
- Improves to 3-for-5 converting the 54-hole lead/co-lead to victory (2022 John Deere Classic, 2024 Shriners Children’s Open, 2026 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- First player to successfully convert the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR since Cameron Young (Cadillac Championship)
- Third player to birdie the 18th hole to force a playoff at the Memorial Tournament and first since Hideki Matsuyama in 2014 (other: David Edwards/1992); all three players went on to win
- First player on record to win the Memorial Tournament when losing strokes off the tee; finished 43rd in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (-1.68); third player on TOUR this season to win when losing strokes off the tee (Akshay Bhatia/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard/-4.36, Brandt Snedeker/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic/-0.52)
- At No. 94 in the Official World Golf Ranking entering the week, becomes the lowest-ranked player in the OWGR to win the Memorial Tournament since William McGirt in 2016 (No. 102)
- Qualifies for the 154th Open Championship at Royal Birkdale as the highest finisher, not otherwise exempt
- Played a total of 33 holes on Sunday (13 holes in R3, 20 in R4 including playoff)

Additional Player Notes

- **Ryan Gerard** (P2/-12) collects his third runner-up finish of the season (2nd/Sony Open in Hawaii, T2/The American Express); led the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (10.55) and took the outright lead with a birdie from 36 feet, 9 inches on the par-4 17th hole; was making his second career Memorial Tournament appearance (T23/2025)
- In his first start since his victory at THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, **Wyndham Clark** (3rd/-11) posts final-round 67 in bid to become second player this season to win in back-to-back starts on TOUR (Matt Fitzpatrick); records his first top-10 finish in his seventh career appearance at the Memorial Tournament
- **Tommy Fleetwood** (T4/-10) eagles the par-5 15th hole – his first in 284 career holes at Muirfield Village – to take the outright lead before making bogey on the par-4 17th; marks his sixth top-10 finish in 11 starts this season

- In search of his first PGA TOUR title since the 2023 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play, **Sam Burns** (T4/-10) posts his best finish of the season and third top-10 (T6/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T7/Masters Tournament); marks his fourth consecutive top-20 finish at the Memorial Tournament
- **Alex Fitzpatrick** (T6/-8) posts 65, tied for the low round of the tournament; has three top-10s in Signature Events since earning TOUR membership following his victory at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans: T9/Cadillac Championship, 4th/Truist Championship, T6/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- **Kristoffer Reitan** (T6/-8) ties the low round of the tournament with bogey-free 65; Truist Championship winner collects fourth top-10 of the season after opening with 3-over 75 in round one
- In his bid to become the first player to win an event on TOUR in three consecutive years since Steve Stricker (2009-11 John Deere Classic), two-time defending champion and World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T12/-4) posts his 32nd consecutive top-25 finish on TOUR
