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Tommy Fleetwood

- Reigning FedExCup Champion seeks to become the first back-to-back winner of the FedExCup
- Had 30 top-five finishes on TOUR before collecting his first career title at the 2025 TOUR Championship, joining Chad Campbell (2003) in making the TOUR Championship their first PGA TOUR victory
- Enters the week at No. 9 in the FedExCup standings after posting eight top-10 finishes on the season, including three T4 results: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship
- With a win, would join Tiger Woods (2007, 2009) and Rory McIlroy (2016, 2019, 2022) as the only players to win multiple FedExCup titles
- One of two players from England to win the FedExCup (Justin Rose/2018)
- Finishes in five prior starts in the TOUR Championship: T11/2018, T16/2019, T6/2023, 20th/2024, Won/2025

Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 making his seventh consecutive start at the TOUR Championship where he has four top-five finishes (5th/2020, T2/2022, Won/2024, T4/2025)
- Eight-stroke victory at the 2026 FedEx St. Jude Championship marked his 21st PGA TOUR title and second this season (The American Express); finished T12 in his title defense at the BMW Championship
- Enters the week with 18 top-25 finishes in 19 starts with only one missed cut on the season (Genesis Scottish Open)
- Leads the TOUR in Greens in Regulation (72.52%), top-10 finishes (12), Scoring Average (68.65) and Official Money (\$20,937,525)
- Has opened with 65 or better in three of his last four TOUR Championship appearances at East Lake Golf Club (63/2025, 65/2024, 65/2022)
- One of five players with more than two wins in FedExCup Playoffs events (Dustin Johnson/6, Rory McIlroy/6, Tiger Woods/4, Patrick Cantlay/3, Scottie Scheffler/3)

Gary Woodland

- Finished T4 at the BMW Championship to move from No. 31 to No. 18 in the FedExCup and qualify for his first TOUR Championship since 2019
- One of three players (Patrick Cantlay, Robert MacIntyre) to move inside the top 30 following the BMW Championship
- Six top-10s in 21 starts this season, including his victory at the Texas Children's Houston Open, his first win on TOUR since the 2019 U.S. Open
- 42-year-old ranks sixth on TOUR in both Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (.610) and Driving Distance (323.2)
- Making his eighth career TOUR Championship appearance with two top-10 finishes (T9/2014, T10/2016)

Wyndham Clark

- Birdied final three holes at Bellerive Country Club to post even par and win the BMW Championship by three strokes over Patrick Cantlay
- Collected his sixth PGA TOUR title and third of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, U.S. Open, BMW Championship), tied for the most on TOUR in 2026 (Matt Fitzpatrick, Chris Gotterup)
- Third career TOUR Championship, with top-10s in his last two appearances (8th/2024, 3rd/2023)
- Moved up to No. 3 in the FedExCup with the victory; in addition to his three wins, posted three top-five finishes this season (3rd/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T5/Travelers Championship, T5/FedEx St. Jude Championship)
- Enters the week ranked inside the top 20 in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (17th), SG: Approach the Green (18th), SG: Around the Green (13th) and SG: Putting (16th)

Adam Scott

- 46-year-old making his 14th career TOUR Championship appearance and first since 2024 (T4)
- Won the 2006 TOUR Championship at East Lake Golf Club in the final year before the creation of the FedExCup
- Enters the week at No. 28 in the FedExCup; posted top-20 finishes in his last three starts (T9/The Open Championship, T12/FedEx St. Jude Championship, T16/BMW Championship)
- One of three players in their 40s to qualify for the TOUR Championship (Justin Rose/46, Gary Woodland/42)

Patrick Cantlay

- 2021 FedExCup Champion posts runner-up finish at BMW Championship to move from No. 43 to No. 19 and qualify for his sixth consecutive TOUR Championship
- Runner-up finish at Bellerive was one of five top-10s this season
- Finished T2 in 2025 after posting 64s in the first and third rounds at East Lake Golf Club
- Eight-time TOUR winner seeks his first title since the 2022 BMW Championship

Alex Fitzpatrick

- At No. 24 in the FedExCup, one of two PGA TOUR rookies to qualify for the TOUR Championship (Kristoffer Reitan/No. 20)
- Earned his first career PGA TOUR title earlier this season at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans alongside his brother, Matt, earning a PGA TOUR card through 2028
- Five top-10s in 13 starts this season (Won/Zurich Classic of New Orleans, T9/Cadillac Championship, 4th/Truist Championship, T6/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T7/Travelers Championship)
- Seeks his first finish of T44 or better since the Travelers Championship (T7)

Rory McIlroy

- Three-time FedExCup champion (2016, 2019, 2022) making 13th tournament start; only player with three FedExCup titles
- World No. 2 qualifies for the TOUR Championship for ninth consecutive season, the longest active streak on TOUR
- 30-time PGA TOUR winner has the most wins of any player in the field (next: 21/Scottie Scheffler)
- Five top-10s in 13 starts this season (Won/Masters Tournament, T2/The Genesis Invitational, T7/PGA Championship, T7/Genesis Scottish Open, 3rd/BMW Championship)
- Finished solo third at last week's BMW Championship to move up to No. 11 in the FedExCup
- Most recent player to defend a title on TOUR (2026 Masters Tournament)
- Nine consecutive seasons with a win, the longest active streak on TOUR
- Seeks his fifth consecutive season with multiple PGA TOUR titles (3/2021-22; 2/2022-23; 2/2024; 3/2025)
- Seeks to become the first player since Scottie Scheffler (2024) to win the Masters Tournament and TOUR Championship in the same year

Si Woo Kim

- Making third career start at the TOUR Championship (T10/2016, T20/2023)
- 11 top-10s in 23 starts this season, highlighted by three runner-up finishes (Farmers Insurance Open, THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, FedEx St. Jude Championship)
- Enters the week as the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup standings without a victory this season (No. 5)
- Enters the week at No. 1 in the International Team standings for the 2026 Presidents Cup; the top six players earn automatic qualifying spots following the TOUR Championship
- Four-time TOUR winner in search of first victory since 2023 Sony Open in Hawaii
- Seeks to become the eighth international player (10 wins) and first from South Korea to win the TOUR Championship

TOUR Championship notes:

- The top 30 players in the FedExCup standings qualified for the TOUR Championship, earning a two-year PGA TOUR exemption and access to major championships that traditionally recognize the top 30
- For the second consecutive year, all players will start the event at even par, providing each qualifier with an equal opportunity to win the FedExCup
- Players will compete for a \$40 million purse, with the FedExCup Champion receiving \$10 million

- The 2026 TOUR Championship marks the 25th playing of the event at East Lake Golf Club and the 20th consecutive year as the FedExCup Playoffs finale
- The field includes:
 - Six FedExCup Champions: **Rory McIlroy** (2016, 2019, 2022), **Justin Rose** (2018), **Patrick Cantlay** (2021), **Viktor Hovland** (2023), **Scottie Scheffler** (2024), **Tommy Fleetwood** (2025)
 - Seven past champions of the TOUR Championship: **Adam Scott** (2006), **Rory McIlroy** (2016, 2019, 2022), **Xander Schauffele** (2017), **Patrick Cantlay** (2021), **Viktor Hovland** (2023), **Scottie Scheffler** (2024), **Tommy Fleetwood** (2025)
 - Six players will make their TOUR Championship debut: **Min Woo Lee**, **Kristoffer Reitan**, **Alex Fitzpatrick**, **Ryan Fox**, **Ryan Gerard**, **Alex Smalley**
 - Two 2026 PGA TOUR rookies: **Kristoffer Reitan** (No. 20), **Alex Fitzpatrick** (No. 24)
- With 46-year-olds **Justin Rose** (No. 27) and **Adam Scott** (No. 28) in the field, it marks the first time since 2009 that multiple players age 45 and older have qualified for the TOUR Championship (Kenny Perry/49, Scott Verplank/45)
- Brothers **Matt Fitzpatrick** and **Alex Fitzpatrick** are the first set of brothers to compete in the TOUR Championship since 1987 (Bobby and Lanny Wadkins)

FedExCup Playoffs and PGA TOUR season notes

- The 2026 PGA TOUR Season marks the 20th edition of the FedExCup (established in 2007), a season-long points competition which culminates with the FedExCup Playoffs, a series of three events to determine the FedExCup Champion
 - The top 70 players qualify for the FedEx St. Jude Championship and are fully exempt for all full-field events and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2027
 - The top 50 players qualify for the BMW Championship and are exempt for all Signature Events in 2027
 - The top 30 players qualify for the TOUR Championship and receive a two-year exemption and invitations to majors that traditionally recognize the top 30
- The winners of the first two FedExCup Playoffs events earned 750 points (the same amount of points as THE PLAYERS Championship and majors), which is down from 2,000 in previous years. As part of the change to the TOUR Championship format in 2025, the reduction in FedExCup points available at the first two Playoffs events places added emphasis on regular-season performance

- Despite not winning an event this season, 12 players earned a two-year exemption on TOUR (thru 2028 season) by advancing to the TOUR Championship: **Si Woo Kim** (No. 5), **Sam Burns** (No. 8), **Tommy Fleetwood** (No. 9), **Ludvig Åberg** (No. 10), **Xander Schauffele** (No. 12), **Hideki Matsuyama** (No. 16), **Ryan Gerard** (No. 17), **Patrick Cantlay** (No. 19), **Min Woo Lee** (No. 21), **Alex Smalley** (No. 23), **Robert MacIntyre** (No. 25), **Adam Scott** (No. 28)
- Of the eight first-time winners in 2026, three advanced to the TOUR Championship: **Jacob Bridgeman** (The Genesis Invitational), **Alex Fitzpatrick** (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), **Kristoffer Reitan** (Truist Championship)
- Five PGA TOUR rookies qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs, with two advancing to the TOUR Championship: **Kristoffer Reitan** (No. 20), **Alex Fitzpatrick** (No. 24)
- Of the 12 international winners of the 36 of the FedExCup Regular Season events, eight qualified for both the FedExCup Playoffs and the TOUR Championship: **Justin Rose**, **Matt Fitzpatrick**, **Rory McIlroy**, **Alex Fitzpatrick**, **Kristoffer Reitan**, **Viktor Hovland**, **Tom Kim**, **Ryan Fox**
- Nine PGA TOUR University alumni advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs, with four advancing to the TOUR Championship: **Chris Gotterup** (No. 6), **Ludvig Åberg** (No. 10), **Jacob Bridgeman** (No. 13), **Alex Fitzpatrick** (No. 24)
- Of the 30 players in the field at the TOUR Championship, **Wyndham Clark** is the only player in the field to finish inside the top 10 at the first two Playoffs events (T5/FedEx St. Jude Championship, 1st/BMW Championship); **Tommy Fleetwood** finished T3 and T4 in the first two Playoffs events in 2025, respectively, before going on to win the FedExCup

Presidents Cup standings

- The top six players in the 2026 U.S. Team standings earned automatic qualifying spots following the BMW Championship: **Scottie Scheffler** (No. 1), **Cameron Young** (No. 2), **Wyndham Clark** (No. 3), **Sam Burns** (No. 4), **Russell Henley** (No. 5), **Collin Morikawa** (No. 6)
- The 2026 International Team will be comprised of six (6) automatic qualifiers and six (6) captain's picks, with the Official World Golf Ranking (OWGR) used to determine the former. The six automatic qualifiers for the International Team will be determined following the 2026 TOUR Championship
- No players ranked beyond No. 6 in the International Team standings qualified for the TOUR Championship
- Following the TOUR Championship, U.S. Team Captain Brandt Snedeker and International Team Captain Geoff Ogilvy will make their six captain's picks live from PGA TOUR Studios on **Tuesday, September 1 at 5 p.m. ET** to round out their 12-man teams that will compete at Medinah Country Club's Course No. 3, Sept. 22-27. The 60-minute show will be streamed on the PGA TOUR's YouTube and FAST channels and broadcast on Golf Channel.
