**Viktor Hovland (1<sup>st</sup>/-15)**

- Birdies four of his last six holes for 65 and his second consecutive 31 on the back nine at East Lake Golf Club
- Seeks his ninth career PGA TOUR victory in his 151<sup>st</sup> start and second FedExCup title (2023)
- Seventh career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recent: 2026 Travelers Championship/Won); 5-for-6 converting to victory

- Making his seventh consecutive TOUR Championship appearance
- Seeking to become the third multiple winner of the FedExCup (Rory McIlroy/2016, 2019, 2022, Tiger Woods/2007, 2009)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (6.819); entered the week ranked 64<sup>th</sup> on TOUR this season
- Three top-10s in 18 starts this season, highlighted by his eighth career PGA TOUR win at the Travelers Championship

**Ryan Gerard (2<sup>nd</sup>/-14)**

- Seeks second career PGA TOUR victory in his 79<sup>th</sup> start (2025 Barracuda Championship) and first in a standard stroke-play event
- Posts 66 and ends the round with bogey-free streak of 35 holes
- One of six players making their TOUR Championship debut; would be the first player since Xander Schauffele (2017) to win the TOUR Championship in their tournament debut
- Owns six top-10s in 25 starts this season, including three runner-up finishes (2<sup>nd</sup>/Sony Open in Hawaii, T2/The American Express, P2/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday); tied with Si Woo Kim for second-most runner-up finishes on TOUR this season (Scottie Scheffler/5)

**Miscellaneous player notes**

- **Adam Scott** (T3/-12) seeks his 15<sup>th</sup> career PGA TOUR title in his 444<sup>th</sup> career start and first since the 2020 Genesis Invitational, a span of 6 years, 6 months, 14 days; at 46 years, 1 month, 14 days, would become the oldest

FedExCup Champion (Vijay Singh/45 years, 7 months, 6 days/2008); marks his best position through 54 holes on TOUR since the 2025 U.S. Open (T2; finished T12); holes 131 feet, 7 inches of putts in round three and has two bogeys through 54 holes, tied for the fewest in the field

- After opening with double bogey on No. 1, **Ludvig Åberg** (T3/-12) cards seven birdies and no bogeys over his final 17 holes for a 65; seeks his third career PGA TOUR victory in his 76<sup>th</sup> start and would become the second FedExCup Champion from Sweden (Henrik Stenson/2013)
- 2024 FedExCup Champion **Scottie Scheffler** (T3/-12) posts bogey-free 66 and seeks his third win on the PGA TOUR when trailing by three or more strokes entering the final round (2024 PLAYERS Championship/5 strokes, 2025 BMW Championship/4 strokes)
- **Chris Gotterup** (T3/-12) seeks his sixth career PGA TOUR victory in his 91<sup>st</sup> start and a TOUR-most four wins this season; trailed by two strokes or more entering the final round in all three wins this season (John Deere Classic/5 strokes, WM Phoenix Open/4 strokes, Sony Open in Hawaii/2 strokes); leads the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (3.048) through three rounds after entering the week No. 11 on TOUR this season
- Three-time FedExCup Champion **Rory McIlroy** (T7/-10) posts 63 to tie his career low round at East Lake Golf Club (R3/2022); has two wins on TOUR when trailing by five or more strokes entering the final round (2022 TOUR Championship/6 strokes, 2016 Deutsche Bank Championship/6 strokes)
- Both **Scottie Scheffler** (solo 13<sup>th</sup> or better) and **Rory McIlroy** (solo 4<sup>th</sup> or better) can surpass Tiger Woods on the PGA TOUR's Career Money list this week:
