Keegan Bradley

- Defending champion and two-time winner of the Travelers Championship (2023, 2025)
- Won the 2025 Travelers Championship by one stroke over 54-hole leader Tommy Fleetwood; made a 5'8" birdie putt on the 72nd hole to secure his eighth PGA TOUR title
- Seeks join Bubba Watson (2010, 2015, 2018) for the second-most wins in tournament history, only trailing Billy Casper (4 wins)
- With a win, would become the first player since Phil Mickelson (2001, 2002) to win back-to-back Travelers Championship titles
- Holds or shares the 36- (125/with Denny McCarthy/2023), 54- (189) and 72-hole (257) tournament scoring records from his 2023 Travelers Championship victory
- In 15 career starts in the Travelers Championship, owns 13 made cuts, seven top-25 finishes and four top-10s
- Woodstock, Vermont native finished T32 in last week's U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club
- Owns four top-25 finishes in 15 starts this season (best: T12/RBC Heritage) and ranks No. 76 in the FedExCup standings

Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 and 2024 Travelers Championship winner is making his seventh start at the event
- Finished T4 at last week's U.S. Open in his first attempt to complete the Career Grand Slam; finished inside the top 10 in 12 of his last 15 starts in major championships
- FedExCup leader and 20-time PGA TOUR winner in search of second victory of the season (The American Express)
- Has made 77 consecutive cuts, the longest active consecutive cuts made streak on TOUR; last missed cut came at the 2022 FedEx St. Jude Championship
- Leads the TOUR in SG: Total (2.204), GIR% (71.69%), Scoring Average (68.44) and Birdie Average (4.71 per round)

Tommy Fleetwood

- 2025 FedExCup Champion enters the week coming off back-to-back T11 finishes (RBC Canadian Open, U.S. Open)
- Making sixth start at the Travelers Championship where he owns three top-15 finishes (T13/2019, 15th/2024, T2/2025)
- Held a three-stroke lead after 54 holes in last year's Travelers Championship; finished T2 following a final-round 72 that included bogeys on two of his final three holes (Nos. 16, 18)
- Seeks to become the second player this season (Gary Woodland/Texas Children's Houston Open) to win a tournament after finishing runner-up in the same event last year
- Has six top-10s in 13 starts this season, highlighted by three top-five finishes in Signature Events: T4/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T5/Truist Championship, T4/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- Enters the week No. 11 in the FedExCup standings

Wyndham Clark

- Earned his fifth PGA TOUR victory and second major championship at last week's U.S. Open
- Shot a final-round 73 to win the 2026 U.S. Open in wire-to-wire fashion in his 204th career start; marked the highest final-round score by a winner on TOUR since Rory McIlroy shot 73 to win the 2025 Masters Tournament
- One of three wire-to-wire winners this season (Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open, Cameron Young/Cadillac Championship)

- In his last four starts on TOUR, owns two wins and has not finished worse than T11: Won/The CJ CUP Byron Nelson, 3rd/Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T11/RBC Canadian Open, Won/U.S. Open
- Sat No. 82 in the FedExCup standings five weeks ago prior to THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson; enters this week No. 4
- One of four players with multiple wins on TOUR this season, joining Matt Fitzpatrick (3), Cameron Young (2) and Chris Gotterup (2)
- With the win, moved to No. 8 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Making his eighth consecutive start and ninth overall in the Travelers Championship (best: T9/2024)

Ben James

- Milford, Connecticut native earned PGA TOUR membership as the No. 1 player from the 2026 PGA TOUR University Ranking
- Made his professional debut two weeks ago at the RBC Canadian Open and finished T54 with rounds of 67-63-78-69
- Competed four seasons at the University of Virginia (2022-26), where he earned seven individual victories (tying Ben Kohles' school record for career wins); his wins included the 2024 Valero Texas Collegiate, which earned him an exemption for the 2025 Valero Texas Open on TOUR
- Became the fifth collegiate golfer in history to earn four All-America First Team honors, following Gary Hallberg (1977-80), Phil Mickelson (1989-92), David Duval (1990-93), and Bryce Molder (1998-2001)
- Finished T2 individually at the 2024 NCAA Championship, finishing behind Georgia Tech's Hiroshi Tai
- Represented the United States at the 2023 and 2025 Walker Cups and the 2023 and 2024 Arnold Palmer Cups

Additional player notes

- 2021 FedExCup champion **Patrick Cantlay** is making his 12th start at the Travelers Championship and has eight consecutive finishes of T15 or better; shot a career low 18-hole score of 60 (R2) at TPC River Highlands in 2011 as an amateur (T24)
- Little Silver, New Jersey native and Rutgers University alum **Chris Gotterup** is making third start at the Travelers Championship (T35/2022, T61/2024); third-year PGA TOUR member owns wins in each of his three seasons on TOUR (four total wins in 83 career starts), including two titles this year: Sony Open in Hawaii and WM Phoenix Open
- **Adam Scott** enters the week after making his 100th consecutive major championship appearance, dating to the 2001 Open Championship (only Jack Nicklaus with 146 has played in more than 100 straight majors); the 14-time PGA TOUR winner has made 438 starts, with his most recent win coming at the 2020 Genesis Invitational

Travelers Championship notes

- At 6,844 yards, TPC River Highlands was the second shortest course on PGA TOUR in 2025 (Port Royal Golf Course/71/6,828 yards)
- The Travelers Championship is the last of eight Signature Events during the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- The field includes:
 - Nine of the top 10 in the FedExCup standings
 - Eight of the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking
 - Five past winners of the Travelers Championship: **Jordan Spieth** (2017), **Harris English** (2021), **Xander Schauffele** (2022), **Keegan Bradley** (2023, 2025), **Scottie Scheffler** (2024)
 - 61 of the 72 players in the field competed at last week's U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club, including five of the top six finishers: **Wyndham Clark** (Won), **Sam Burns** (2nd), **J.T. Poston** (T4), **Keith Mitchell** (T4), **Scottie Scheffler** (T4)
 - Four sponsor exemptions: **Tony Finau**, **Ben James**, **Jordan Spieth**, **Keith Mitchell**
- Players earning spots in the field via the Aon Next 10 (top FedExCup points earners through the U.S. Open): **Wyndham Clark**, **Kristoffer Reitan**, **Alex Smalley**, **Alex Fitzpatrick**, **Gary Woodland**, **Min Woo Lee**, **Aaron Rai**, **Nicolai Højgaard**, **Adam Scott**, **Jake Knapp**

PGA TOUR season notes

- Following a T4 finish at last week's U.S. Open, **Scottie Scheffler** (3,111) reclaims the lead in the 2026 FedExCup standings and holds a 241-point lead over **Matt Fitzpatrick** (2,870)
 - There have been seven international winners on TOUR this season; the Travelers Championship has not had an international winner since Russell Knox in 2016, marking the longest active streak without an international winner on TOUR
 - There have been five first-time winners in the first 25 events on TOUR this season: **Jacob Bridgeman** (The Genesis Invitational), **Ricky Castillo** (Puerto Rico Open), **Alex Fitzpatrick** (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), **Kristoffer Reitan** (Truist Championship), **Bud Cauley** (RBC Canadian Open); the last player to make the Travelers Championship his first TOUR title was Ken Duke (2013)
 - The 54-hole leader/co-leader has gone on to win nine of 24 individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season, including **Wyndham Clark** at last week's U.S. Open
 - **Scottie Scheffler** and **Si Woo Kim** (No. 5 in FedExCup standings) lead all players in top-10 finishes this season with eight
 - There have been four rounds of 60's recorded on TOUR this season and two sub-60 scores at the Travelers Championship

 - 60, Si Woo Kim, R2, TPC Craig Ranch, THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson
