Viktor Hovland (1st/-20)

- Seeks his eighth PGA TOUR title in his 146th start; age on Sunday: 28 years, 9 months, 10 days
- Has two top-five finishes since his last win at the 2025 Valspar Championship (3rd/2025 U.S. Open, 3rd/2026 RBC Canadian Open)
- Holds sixth 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; is 4-for-5 to date in converting to victory
 - 2025 Valspar Championship
 - 2023 TOUR Championship
 - 2021 World Wide Technology Championship
 - 2020 Puerto Rico Open
- Would become the 10th 54-hole leader/co-leader to win on TOUR this season (individual stroke-play events)
- At 190, sets career-best 54-hole score on TOUR (previous: 194/2021 World Wide Technology Championship/Won)
- Sets low opening 54-hole score on TOUR this season (previous 192: Si Woo Kim/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, Gary Woodland/Texas Children's Houston Open)
- One stroke shy of tying lowest opening 54-hole score at event since it moved to TPC River Highlands in 1984 (189/Keegan Bradley/2023/Won)
- Would become the first Norwegian winner of the Travelers Championship
- Would become the seventh international winner of the event and first since Russell Knox in 2016, ending the longest active streak without an international winner on TOUR
- Would become the eighth international winner (10th win) on TOUR this season and second Norwegian (Kristoffer Reitan/Truist Championship)
- Victory would come in sixth Travelers Championship start (T54/2019, T11/2020, T29/2023, T20/2024, WD/2025)
 - Entered the 2025 final round T14 and withdrew on the third hole due to neck injury
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (2.979) and Strokes Gained: Putting (5.780)

Scottie Scheffler (2nd/-19)

- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader seeks his 21st win in his 164th start at the age of 30 years, 7 days
- With a win, would become the 36th player to reach 21 wins on the PGA TOUR and move to T32 on the all-time wins list
 - Others: Davis Love III, Willie MacFarlane, Lanny Wadkins, Craig Wood
- 2024 Travelers Championship winner would become ninth player to win the event multiple times and second consecutive (Keegan Bradley/2023, 2025)
- Making seventh straight start at the Travelers Championship (T6/2025, Won/2024, T4/2023, T13/2022, T47/2021, MC/2020)
- Win would be second of the season (The American Express) and would join Matt Fitzpatrick (3), Cameron Young (2), Chris Gotterup (2) and Wyndham Clark (2) as multiple winners on TOUR this season
- Would be his fifth consecutive season with multiple wins (4/2022, 2/2023, 7/2024, 6/2025)
- Enters the week with 34 straight top-25 finishes, the second-most in the past 40 years (most: 38/Tiger Woods)
- Has 15 top-10 finishes in Signature Events, the most of any player since 2024
- Holds the TOUR's current longest streak of consecutive made cuts (78); last missed cut came at the 2022 FedEx St. Jude Championship

Additional Notes

- 2021 FedExCup Champion **Patrick Cantlay** (T3/-15) is making his 12th start at the Travelers Championship and has eight consecutive finishes of T15 or better; the eight-time PGA TOUR winner's most recent win came at the 2022 BMW Championship
- **Akshay Bhatia** (T3/-15) seeks fourth TOUR victory and second this season (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)

- **Wyndham Clark** (T5/-13) is seeking to become the sixth player all-time and the first since Ernie Els at the 1997 FedEx St. Jude Championship to win the week after winning the U.S. Open; the last player to win on TOUR the week after a major is Scottie Scheffler (2024 Masters, 2024 RBC Heritage)
- **Matt Fitzpatrick** (T5/-13) is seeking to become the first player from England to earn four wins in a season and the first player to earn four or more wins in a season since Scottie Scheffler in 2025
- PGA Championship winner **Aaron Rai** (T22/-10) is the only player in the field bogey-free through 54 holes
