Sungjae Im (1st/-9)

- Earns his sixth career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and his second this season (Valspar Championship/finished T4)
- Finished inside the top 25 at the Truist Championship each of the last three years, including back-to-back top-10 finishes the last two times the event was hosted at Quail Hollow Club (2025/T23, 2024/T4, 2023/T8)
- First-round 64 tied his season low (Valspar Championship/R1)
- Returned to competition in March after being sidelined for five months with a wrist injury
- In seven starts this season, owns one top-25 finish (T4/Valspar Championship)
- Entered the week No. 104 in the FedExCup standings
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner: 2020 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, 2021 Shriners Children's Open
- Seeks to become the third straight 36-hole leader at a Signature Event to go on to win (Cameron Young/Cadillac Championship, Matt Fitzpatrick/RBC Heritage)

Tommy Fleetwood (2nd/-8)

- Making his sixth career start in the Truist Championship where he finished T14 or better in each of his last four appearances: T4/2025, T13/2024, T5/2023, T14/2021
- In eight starts this season, owns five top-25 finishes, including four top-10s (best: T4/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- 134 marks his best 36-hole total in six career starts at Quail Hollow Club (previous: 136, 2023 Truist Championship)
- Marks his best 36-hole position on TOUR this season (previous: T4, Masters Tournament, finished T33)
- 2025 FedExCup champion seeking his second PGA TOUR title in his 173rd career start

Additional notes

- In the 22 years of the Truist Championship, only two players have held the 36-hole lead/co-lead and gone on to win the event: Tiger Woods (2007) and Wyndham Clark (2023)
- Following rounds of 67 and 68, **Justin Thomas** (T3/-7) records his best 36-hole score of the season (135); in eight career starts at Quail Hollow Club, he owns three top-15 finishes (2023 Truist Championship/T14, 2017 PGA Championship/Won, 2015 Truist Championship/T7)
- **Alex Fitzpatrick** (T3/-7) enters the weekend inside the top 10 on the leaderboard for the third consecutive week: T2 at Zurich Classic of New Orleans (Won) and T6 at Cadillac Championship (finished T9)
- 2012 Truist Championship winner **Rickie Fowler** (T8/-5) cards the low round of the day with an 8-under 63, his lowest score in 50 career rounds at Quail Hollow Club (previous best: 66, two times); in 13 career starts in the Truist Championship, owns four top-10 finishes (2010/6th, 2012/Won, 2016/T4, 2019/T4)
- Four-time Truist Championship winner **Rory McIlroy** (T8/-5) records a career-best 14 consecutive greens hit (Nos. 4-17); through 36 holes, ranks second in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (2.798) and fourth in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (5.040)
- 18-hole solo leader **Matt McCarty** (T8/-5) follows his first-round 63 with a 3-over 74
- Defending champion **Sepp Straka** (T17/-3) seeks to become the first player to successfully defend at the Truist Championship
- Rookie **Chandler Blanchet** (T33/E) aces the 188-yard par-3 17th, his first hole-in-one on TOUR in his 16th career start; marks the fourth ace on No. 17 at Quail Hollow Club (Mark Hubbard/2023/R2, Carlos Ortiz/2016/R2, Colt Knost/2015/R1)
- **Aldrich Potgieter** (T68/+5) leads the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (2.906) and ranks last in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (-4.057)
- Cumulative Green Monster statistics (Nos. 16-18) through two rounds:
 - The field is -153 on Nos. 1-15 and +101 on Nos. 16-18
