Completed Third-Round Notes – Sunday, April 5, 2026

Weather: *Saturday:* Cloudy with showers and afternoon thunderstorms. High of 76. Variable wind; S/SE 6-12 mph in the morning; N/NE 15-25 mph in the afternoon, with gusts to 40 mph. *Sunday:* Cloudy morning with intermittent showers. High of 64. Wind N/NE 8-16 mph, with gusts up to 24 mph.

Suspension summary: Due to inclement weather, the third round was suspended Saturday at 11:51 a.m. CT, with the entire field yet to complete the round. The third round resumed Sunday at 7:46 a.m. local time and was completed at 11:15 a.m. Final-round tee times will run from 10 a.m. – 12:01 p.m. off split tees and groups were not re-paired following the third round.

Robert MacIntyre (1st/-14)

- Earns his third career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-2 converting (2024 RBC Canadian Open/Won, 2025 BMW Championship/2nd)
- Had 12 holes to complete in his third round Sunday morning and played those holes 1-over par with one birdie (No. 7) and two bogeys (Nos. 9 and 18)
- One stroke shy of the lowest 54-hole score in the Valero Texas Open since the event moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010
 - Record: 201 (Si Woo Kim/2019, Akshay Bhatia/2024)
- Seeking to become the third straight lefthander to win the Valero Texas Open (Akshay Bhatia/2024, Brian Harman/2025)
- Would become the fourth player this season to win after holding the lead/co-lead after 36 and 54 holes (Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open, Jacob Bridgeman/The Genesis Invitational, Gary Woodland/Texas Children’s Houston Open)
- Making his second start at the Valero Texas Open (2022/T35)
- In six starts this season, has two top-10 finishes (T4/Sony Open in Hawaii, 4th/THE PLAYERS Championship)
- Entered the week No. 23 in the FedExCup standings
- In search of his third win in his 84th PGA TOUR start (2024 RBC Canadian Open, 2024 Genesis Scottish Open)

Additional notes

- The last spot in the Masters Tournament is available to the winner of the Valero Texas Open if not otherwise qualified; three of the last six winners of the Valero Texas Open qualified for the Masters Tournament with their victory (2019/Corey Connors, 2022/J.J. Spaun, 2024/Akshay Bhatia)
- Of the five players who sit 13-under or better after 54 holes, two have not yet qualified for next week’s Masters Tournament: **Ryo Hisatsune** (T2/-13) and **Andrew Putnam** (T2/-13)
- In his 72nd career start on TOUR, **Ryo Hisatsune** (T2/-13) seeks his first win (best finish: T2/2026 Farmers Insurance Open); entered the week No. 21 in the FedExCup standings after recording three top-10 finishes in nine starts this season; finished T5 in the 2025 Valero Texas Open
- **Michael Kim** (T2/-13) follows second-round 65 with a bogey-free 66; seeks his second PGA TOUR title and first since the 2018 John Deere Classic; best finish in six previous starts in the Valero Texas Open is T21 (2016)
- **Andrew Putnam** (T2/-13) is bidding for his second win on TOUR in his 250th career start (2018 Barracuda Championship); owns one top-10 finish in eight prior starts in the Valero Texas Open (T8/2018)
- **Ludvig Åberg** (T2/-13) is one of four players to records scores in the 60s in each of the first three rounds, along with **Ryo Hisatsune** (T2/-13), **J.J. Spaun** (T6/-12) and **Sam Ryder** (T9/-11)
- **Matt Wallace** (T6/-12) records the best score of the third round with an 8-under 64, tied for the second-lowest 18-hole score in his PGA TOUR career (best: 63, 2024 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/R1); in four prior starts in the Valero Texas Open, owns three made cuts and one top-10 finish (3rd/2021)
