Completed Second-Round Notes – Saturday, April 4, 2026

Weather: *Friday:* Cloudy with intermittent afternoon showers and thunderstorms. High of 87. Wind ESE 15-20 mph, with gusts to 30 mph. *Saturday:* Cloudy. High of 71. Wind SSE 6-12 mph.

Suspension summary: *Friday:* Play was suspended due to lightning in the area at 5:46 p.m. local time and resumed at 6:31 p.m. (delay of 45 minutes). Play was suspended due to darkness at 7:55 p.m., with Luke Clanton (T60/-2 at the time) the lone player yet to complete his round. *Saturday:* The second round resumed at 7:29 a.m. and was completed at 7:38 a.m. Due to forecasted inclement weather, starting times for the third round will consist of threesomes off split tees from 8:10 – 10:11 a.m. local time.

36-hole cut: 70 players at 2-under 142 from a field of 132 professionals. Luke Clanton made birdie from 35'10" on his final hole Saturday (No. 9) to move to 3-under 141 (T43).

Robert MacIntyre (1st/-14)

- At 14-under 130, sets the lowest opening 36-hole score since the Valero Texas Open moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010; Si Woo Kim (2019) and Brian Harman (2025) held the previous low score of 12-under
- 130 equals his second-lowest opening 36-hole score, set previously at the 2024 RBC Canadian Open (won) and the 2025 TOUR Championship (T17); lowest score of 126 led to a runner-up finish at the 2025 BMW Championship
- Seeking to become the third straight lefthander to win the Valero Texas Open (Akshay Bhatia/2024, Brian Harman/2025)
- Four-shot lead is one shy of the largest 36-hole lead since the event moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010:
 - 5 (Akshay Bhatia/2024/won)
 - 4 (Brian Harman/2025/won, Si Woo Kim/2019/finished T4)
- One shy of the largest 36-hole lead this season (5, Daniel Berger/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Holds his third 36-hole lead/co-lead; 1-for-2 converting to victory (2024 RBC Canadian Open/won, 2025 BMW Championship/2nd)
- Leads field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (9.362), Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (6.916) and Sand Saves (3/3; T1)
- Making his second start at the Valero Texas Open (2022/T35)
- In six starts this season, has two top-10 finishes (T4/Sony Open in Hawaii, 4th/THE PLAYERS Championship)
- Entered the week No. 23 in the FedExCup standings
- In search of his third win in his 84th PGA TOUR start (2024 RBC Canadian Open, 2024 Genesis Scottish Open)

Additional notes

- **Ludvig Åberg** (2nd/-10) is coming off of back-to-back top-5 finishes for the first time in his career (T3/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, T5/THE PLAYERS Championship); holed out for eagle with a sand wedge from 120 yards on the par-4 sixth hole, his sixth eagle on a par-4 in 63 TOUR starts
- **Tony Finau** (T3/-9) leads the field with two eagles (R1/No. 14, R2/No. 18); six-time TOUR winner in search of his first win since the 2023 VidantaWorld Mexico Open
- **Kevin Roy, Bud Cauley and Thorbjørn Olesen**, all T3 at 9-under, trail by five in bid for their first PGA TOUR victory; of the 15 winners of the Valero Texas Open since the event moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010, six recorded their first PGA TOUR win at the event, most recently J.J. Spaun in 2022
- Most starts among active players on the PGA TOUR without a win since 1983 (entering the week): **Patrick Rodgers** (322; missed cut), **Mark Hubbard** (271; T61), **Beau Hossler** (240; T43), **Sam Ryder** (235; T7), **Bud Cauley** (232; T3)
- First-round leader **Mark Hubbard** (T61/-2) followed a 65 with a 5-over 77 to fall 12 strokes behind MacIntyre
- Second-round scores for notable players:
 - Highest-ranked player in the field (No. 4) **Tommy Fleetwood** (T13/-7)
 - 2022 Valero Texas Open winner and reigning U.S. Open champion **J.J. Spaun** (T15/-6)

- Defending champion **Brian Harman** (T43/-3)
 - 13-time PGA TOUR winner and 2021 Valero Texas Open champion **Jordan Spieth** (T61/-2)
