Weather: *Friday:* Mostly sunny. High of 81. Wind SSE 4-10 mph. *Saturday:* Mostly sunny. High of 82. Wind SW 4-8 mph.

Suspension Summary: The second round was suspended due to darkness at 6:17 p.m. MT. Play resumed Saturday morning at 8:12 a.m. MT, with three players yet to complete their round, and was completed at 8:31 a.m. MT.

36-hole cut: 73 players at 1-under 141 from a field of 123 professionals.

Ryo Hisatsune (1st/-11)

- Plays his final six holes in 6-under (four birdies, one eagle) for a 63, his low 18-hole score in 208 career rounds on TOUR
- 131 marks his career-low 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 132/2024 Puerto Rico Open, 2024 American Express)
- First career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; entered the week with one career lead/co-lead after any round on TOUR (2024 Puerto Rico Open/R1/finished T18)
- Finished T2 at last week's Farmers Insurance Open, his best career finish on TOUR in 65 starts
- Seeks to become the sixth different player from Japan to win on the PGA TOUR (Hideki Matsuyama, Shigeki Maruyama, Isao Aoki, Ryuji Imada, Satoshi Kodaira)
- Entered the week No. 4 in the Aon Swing 5 standings, with the top five after this week's WM Phoenix Open qualifying for the first two Signature Events of the season at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational; has one career start in a Signature Event (2025 RBC Heritage/T18)
- Third-year TOUR member finished No. 95 in the 2025 FedExCup Fall standings to retain exempt status for 2026; first earned his card for the 2024 season via the 2023 DP World Tour Top 10 (No. 10)
- Was named the 2023 Sir Henry Cotton Rookie of the Year on the DP World Tour, the first player from Japan to win the award
- Will play alongside fellow countryman Hideki Matsuyama in round three, the second time the two have played in the same group on TOUR (2024 PGA Championship/R4; Hisatsune: 67, Matsuyama: 71)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Two-time WM Phoenix Open champion (2016, 2017) **Hideki Matsuyama** (2nd/-10) posts 64 for his second-lowest 18-hole score in 47 career tournament rounds at the WM Phoenix Open (63/R3/2015); birdies six in a row (Nos. 13-18) to equal his longest streak of consecutive birdies on TOUR (2023 Sentry/R3); back-nine 30 marks his career-low score on the back nine at TPC Scottsdale
- 18-hole leader **Chris Gotterup** (T3/-8) posts even-par 71 with his second consecutive eagle at the par-5 13th hole; leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (7.488) and Strokes Gained: Around the Green (4.128)
- In his WM Phoenix Open debut, **Pierceson Coody** (T3/-8) cards 68 in round two; Coody, who finished T2 at last week's Farmers Insurance Open, is one of three players to finish inside the top 25 in each of the first three events of the 2026 season (others: Ryan Gerard, Si Woo Kim); re-earned exempt status on TOUR for 2026 by finishing No. 12 in the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List; currently sits atop the Aon Swing 5 standings in search of his first start in a Signature Event
- England's **John Parry** (T5/-7) birdies Nos. 13-16 for the second day in a row en route to a 66; 39-year-old PGA TOUR rookie earned TOUR membership for 2026 after finishing fifth in the 2025 DP World Tour Top 10; posted seven top-10s on the DP

World Tour in 2025, including a win at the AfrAsia Bank Mauritius Open, his second career DP World Tour title and first since 2010

- After a 2-over 73 in round one, **Si Woo Kim** (T5/-7) posts 9-under 62 – with a bogey on his opening hole – for his low 18-hole score in 36 career rounds at TPC Scottsdale (previous: 66, twice)
- **Sahith Theegala** (T5/-7) cards two eagles (Nos. 3 and 13) for the second time in his career (2026 American Express/R2); entered the week with top-10s in each of his last two starts on TOUR (T8/The American Express, T7/Farmers Insurance Open); has two top-five finishes in four previous starts at the WM Phoenix Open (T3/2022, 5th/2024)
- After opening with a 73, World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T28/-4) posts bogey-free 65 and sits seven strokes back of the lead; Scheffler has two wins when trailing by seven or more strokes through 36 holes (9 strokes/2022 WM Phoenix Open, 8 strokes/2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Two-time WM Phoenix Open champion (2015, 2021) **Brooks Koepka** (T86/+2) posts rounds of 75-69 to miss the cut
