Playoff:

- 22nd playoff in tournament history and first since 2024 (Nick Taylor def. Charley Hoffman)
- Playoff records:

Chris Gotterup (Winner/-16)

- Fourth career PGA TOUR title in his 71st start at the age of 26 years, 6 months, 19 days
- PGA TOUR wins (4): 2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, 2025 Genesis Scottish Open, 2026 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2026 WM Phoenix Open
- FedExCup leader entering the week claims his second victory in three starts this season (Sony Open in Hawaii/Won, Farmers Insurance Open/T18, WM Phoenix Open/Won); marks his third victory in his last 10 starts on TOUR
- Began the final round four strokes back of Matsuyama (T11); marks his second come-from-behind victory on TOUR (2026 Sony Open in Hawaii/trailed by 2)
- 64 ties his low final-round score on TOUR (2026 Sony Open in Hawaii/Won, 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/T15); birdied five of his last six holes (Nos. 13-15, 17-18)
- Nine birdies ties his career-high in a round on TOUR (2025 Genesis Scottish Open/R2/Won)
- First winner of the WM Phoenix Open to come from behind in the final round since Scottie Scheffler (2022)
- Held the outright 18-hole lead after an opening-round 63; had missed the cut in two previous appearances in this event (2024, 2025)

Miscellaneous Notes

- 54-hole leader **Hideki Matsuyama** (P2/-16) posts 68 with his lone bogey coming at the 72nd hole to send him to a playoff with Gotterup; falls to 5-for-6 when holding the outright 54-hole lead on TOUR; was seeking to become the fifth player with three victories at the WM Phoenix Open, with his previous two titles coming in playoffs
- **Si Woo Kim** (T3/-15) posts three consecutive top-10 finishes on TOUR for the first time in his career in 304 starts (T6/The American Express, T2/Farmers Insurance Open, T3/WM Phoenix Open); is one of two players to finish inside the top 20 in all four events to start the 2026 season (other: Pierceson Coody)
- World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T3/-15) posts final-round 64 for his 17th consecutive top-10 on TOUR, the first player since Billy Casper in 1965 to accomplish the feat

- **Akshay Bhatia** (T3/-15) cards third consecutive 67 to mark his best finish on TOUR since a T3 at the 2025 PLAYERS Championship; entered the week having missed the cut in his first two starts of the 2026 season
- In search of his first TOUR title, **Michael Thorbjørnsen** (T3/-15) eagles the par-5 15th hole to take the lead before making bogey on Nos. 16 and 17; marks his seventh top-five finish in his 48th career start on TOUR
- **Nicolai Højgaard** (T3/-15) cards 68 with a triple-bogey 7 on the par-4 second hole; fifth top-five finish in 58th career start on TOUR

Aon Swing 5

- The WM Phoenix Open was the final opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5 to gain entry into each of the next two Signature Events (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational); the top five players, not otherwise exempt, who earned the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express, Farmers Insurance Open and the WM Phoenix Open qualified for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
