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Alex Fitzpatrick

- Former Wake Forest University standout is making his debut start at the Wyndham Championship
- Has five top-10 finishes in 10 starts this season; most recently finished T71 at The Open Championship
- With a tournament-record 31-under 257, he and brother Matt, won the 2026 Zurich Classic of New Orleans
- Became the first non-member and sponsor exemption to win on TOUR since Michael Brennan (2025 Bank of Utah Championship)
- With his win in New Orleans, earned a PGA TOUR card through 2028
- No. 19 in the FedExCup standings
- Ranked third in Wake Forest program history with a career stroke average of 70.94 (2018-2022) and helped lead the Demon Deacons to the 2022 ACC tournament title during his senior season

Ryan Gerard

- Second-year member and former University of North Carolina standout is making his third start at the Wyndham Championship (2023/MC, 2025/MC)
- One win in 75 starts (2025 Barracuda Championship)
- Has three runner-up finishes in 22 starts this season (2nd/Sony Open in Hawaii, T2/The American Express, P2/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- No. 16 in the FedExCup standings
- Raleigh, North Carolina native played five seasons at the University of North Carolina (2017-22), winning once individually and garnering 2022 All-America Second Team and All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors

Jackson Koivun

- Making his second appearance at the Wyndham Championship (2025/T5 as a sponsor exemption)
- 21-year-old enters the week two weeks removed from his first PGA TOUR title at the 3M Open where he earned a three-stroke victory over runner-up Scottie Scheffler
- Became the youngest winner since Aldrich Potgieter at the 2025 Rocket Classic, as well as the youngest American player to win a PGA TOUR event by multiple strokes since the 1932 WM Phoenix Open (Ralph Guldahl)
- Recorded three bogey-free rounds at the 3M Open and broke the 72-hole tournament scoring record with a 25-under 259
- With the win, climbed from 194th to 70th in the FedExCup standings and 206th to 73rd in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Currently No. 70 in the FedExCup standings and seeks to qualify for the Playoffs as a rookie
- Owns three top-25 finishes in five starts this season: T23/U.S. Open (last start as amateur), MC/John Deere Classic, T10/ISCO Championship, Won/3M Open, T31/Rocket Classic
- Former No. 1 ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking turned professional last month, accepting PGA TOUR membership via PGA TOUR University Accelerated; became the third player to earn a TOUR card through the Accelerated program, joining Vanderbilt's Gordon Sargent and Florida State's Luke Clanton; had the option to accept PGA TOUR membership in June 2025 but opted to return to Auburn for his 2025-26 junior season
- Prior to turning professional, spent 56 consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 in World Amateur Golf Ranking, the third-longest reign in history, only behind Keita Nakajima (87 weeks) and Jon Rahm (60 weeks)
- First college player to sweep Fred Haskins, Ben Hogan, Jack Nicklaus and Phil Mickelson national awards in same season (2024)

- Made 10 starts as an amateur on TOUR, which included a stretch of four consecutive finishes of T11 or better in 2025 (T11/John Deere Classic, T6/ISCO Championship, T5/Wyndham Championship, T4/Procore Championship)

Aaron Rai

- 2024 Wyndham Championship winner is making his fifth start at the event (T71/2022, MC/2023, Won/2024, T5/2025)
- With his two-stroke win in 2024, became the first player from England to win the Wyndham Championship
- Reigning PGA Championship winner became the eighth Englishman to win a major championship since 1940
- Has two TOUR victories (2024 Wyndham Championship, 2026 PGA Championship) and owns three career wins each on the DP World Tour and HotelPlanner Tour
- Enters the week No. 35 in the FedExCup standings

Brandt Snedeker

- 2007 and 2018 Wyndham Championship winner is making his 18th start at the Wyndham Championship
- Serves as the U.S. Team Captain for the 2026 Presidents Cup to be contested at Medinah Country Club (September 24-27)
- 10-time TOUR winner picked up his most recent victory at the 2026 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic
- No. 83 in the FedExCup standings, with one top-10 finish in 16 starts

Cameron Young

- Seeking to become the first player to successfully defend at the event since Sam Snead in 1956
- Six-stroke victory over Mac Meissner at the 2025 Wyndham Championship; 72-hole score of 258 matched the tournament 72-hole scoring record (Henrik Stenson/2017, J.T. Poston/2019)
- Making his third start at the Wyndham Championship (T22/2024, Won/2025)
- Three-time winner is one of four players with multiple wins on TOUR this season, having won THE PLAYERS Championship and Cadillac Championship (others: Matt Fitzpatrick/3, Chris Gotterup/3, Wyndham Clark/2)
- World No. 3 has made the cut in all 16 starts on TOUR this season, recording eight top-10 finishes, highlighted by two victories
- No. 3 in the FedExCup standings
- Former Wake Forest University standout; other current/former Demon Deacons in the field: Alex Fitzpatrick, Webb Simpson, Michael Brennan, Open Qualifier Lorenzo Rodriguez

Bubble Notes

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will advance to the FedEx St. Jude Championship; Shane Lowry (No. 60) is the only player ranked from Nos. 60-80 in the FedExCup standings who is not in the field
- In 2025, **Chris Kirk** (T5) was the only player to move inside the top 70 following the Wyndham Championship
- **Jason Day** (No. 75) and **Keegan Bradley** (No. 72) both sit outside the top 70 and are seeking to extend their streak of consecutive Playoffs appearances, with Day going for his 19th (since 2008) while Bradley seeks his 16th (since 2011)

Wyndham Championship notes

- Since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007, the Wyndham Championship has played host to the FedExCup Regular Season finale (since 2008 at Sedgefield Country Club)
- This year marks the 87th annual Wyndham Championship, having been included on the PGA TOUR schedule since 1938 (the seventh-longest running TOUR event excluding the majors)
- The Wyndham Championship winner will receive 500 FedExCup points, a two-year exemption on the PGA TOUR and \$1,530,000; the winner will also be exempt for THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and PGA Championship in 2027
- Additional field highlights:
 - 12 winners on TOUR this season, combining for 13 wins; led by two-time winner **Cameron Young**
 - 15 of the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking are in the field, led by No. 3 **Cameron Young**
 - 67 of the top 100 in the FedExCup standings (and 21 of the top 50), led by No. 3 **Cameron Young**
 - Four past FedExCup champions: **Brandt Snedeker** (2012), **Billy Horschel** (2014), **Jordan Spieth** (2015), **Justin Thomas** (2017)
 - Eight past champions (nine wins): **Cameron Young** (2025), **Aaron Rai** (2024), **Lucas Glover** (2023), **Tom Kim** (2022), **J.T. Poston** (2019), **Brandt Snedeker** (2007, 2018), **Camilo Villegas** (2014), **Webb Simpson** (2011)
 - Sponsor exemptions: **Kihei Akina**, **Zac Blair**, **Hayden Springer**, **Camilo Villegas**
 - Open Qualifiers: **Luke List**, **William McGirt**, **Keenan Huskey**, **Lorenzo Rodriguez**

PGA TOUR season notes

- The Wyndham Championship is the final event of the regular season as players fight to improve their positions in the FedExCup standing ahead of the FedExCup Playoffs
- At the conclusion of the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will qualify for the first event of the Playoffs, the FedEx St. Jude Championship (Aug. 13-16)
- Following the FedEx St. Jude Championship, the top 50 players in the FedExCup standings will qualify for the BMW Championship (Aug. 20-23); after the BMW Championship, the top 30 players in the standings advance to the TOUR Championship (Aug. 27-30)
- Scottie Scheffler (4,123) holds a 794-point lead in the FedExCup standings over Matt Fitzpatrick (3,329)
- Matt Fitzpatrick and Chris Gotterup lead the TOUR with three victories each this season; Wyndham Clark and **Cameron Young** are the only other players with multiple wins this season (two each)
- There have been eight first-time winners in the first 33 events on TOUR this season: Jacob Bridgeman (The Genesis Invitational), **Ricky Castillo** (Puerto Rico Open), **Alex Fitzpatrick** (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), Kristoffer Reitan (Truist Championship), **Bud Cauley** (RBC Canadian Open), **Stefano Mazzoli** (Corales Puntacana Championship), **Jackson Koivun** (3M Open), Michael Thorbjornsen (Rocket Classic)
- Four rookies have won this season: **Alex Fitzpatrick** (Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with Matt Fitzpatrick), Kristoffer Reitan (Truist Championship), **Stefano Mazzoli** (Corales Puntacana Championship), **Jackson Koivun** (3M Open)
- Three players this season earned their first PGA TOUR win within their first 13 starts on TOUR: **Alex Fitzpatrick** (11th TOUR start at Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with Matt Fitzpatrick), **Stefano Mazzoli** (3rd TOUR start at Corales Puntacana Championship), **Jackson Koivun** (13th TOUR start at 3M Open)
- The 54-hole leader/co-leader has gone on to win 11 of 32 individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season, most recently 3M Open winner **Jackson Koivun**
