Weather: Partly cloudy. High of 88. Wind SW 6-12 mph. Play was suspended due to a dangerous weather situation at 5:26 p.m. ET and resumed at 6 p.m. (34-minute delay).

36-hole cut: 80 professionals and one amateur (**Kihei Akina**) at 3-under 137 from a field of 145 professionals and two amateurs

Beau Hossler leads by one over Ben James and Jordan Smith at the midway point of the Wyndham Championship

- All seeking their first PGA TOUR win, veteran **Beau Hossler** leads by one over rookies **Ben James** and **Jordan Smith** at the midway point of the season's final regular season event
- There have been eight first-time winners this season, including three straight: Stefano Mazzoli (Corales Puntacana Championship), Jackson Koivun (3M Open), Michael Thorbjornsen (Rocket Classic)
 - The Wyndham Championship has had 23 first-time winners, including three of the last four (Tom Kim/2022, Aaron Rai/2024, Cameron Young/2025)
 - Of the top 13 players on the leaderboard, only **Billy Horschel** (8), **Sahith Theegala** (1) and **Michael Brennan** (1) have won on TOUR
- With a win, James and Smith would become the first player since Tom Kim (2022) to win in their debut appearance at the Wyndham Championship and the fifth rookie winner of the season (Alex Fitzpatrick, Kristoffer Reitan, Stefano Mazzoli, Jackson Koivun)

Beau Hossler (1st/-12)

- First-round leader follows a 9-under 61 with a 67 to maintain a one-stroke lead; Brandt Snedeker (2018) is the last wire-to-wire winner of the Wyndham Championship
- Holds seventh 36-hole lead/co-lead in an individual stroke-play event (0-for-6 to date, most recently finishing second at the 2024 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- Makes seventh appearance at the Wyndham Championship with his two best results coming in his two most recent starts (T12/2024, T15/2025)
- Currently No. 122 in the standings, needs a win to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs
- Owns one top-10 finish in 18 starts this season (T3/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
- Sits third on the list of active players with the most PGA TOUR starts without a win (entering this week): **Patrick Rodgers** (333), **Mark Hubbard** (282), **Beau Hossler** (251), Sam Ryder (241 – not in the field this week), **Zac Blair** (237), **Denny McCarthy** (233)

FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will qualify for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs):
 - Players currently moving into the top 70: **Beau Hossler** (1st), from No. 122 to No. 53
 - Players currently falling out of the top 70: **Jackson Koivun** (T38), from No. 70 to No. 71
- **Jason Day** (MC/+4) fails to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his career; entered the season with 18 straight appearances in the Playoffs (which was the longest active Playoffs appearance streak)
- **Keegan Bradley** (T64/-3) makes the cut on the number to keep his Playoffs hopes alive; currently projected No. 73 after entering the week No. 72 in the standings; seeking to extend his streak of consecutive Playoffs appearances to 16

Additional notes:

- **Ben James** (T2/-11), the No. 1 player in the PGA TOUR University Ranking, is the only player in the field with three eagles, including a holed 50-degree wedge (109 yards) on his opening hole Friday (No. 10); makes the cut for the seventh time in eight starts as a professional, including a T4 at last month's Corales Puntacana Championship, his best result in 16 starts

- **Jordan Smith** (T2/-11) has eagled No. 5 both days; with a victory, would become the 21st international winner (22nd win) of the event and the second from England (Aaron Rai/2024); solo-third finish at the 2026 Valspar Championship marks career-best finish in 38 TOUR starts
- **Cameron Young** (T64/-3) birdies four of his final eight holes to make the cut on the number; just the second defending champion of the event since 2019 to make the cut in title defense (Aaron Rai/T5/2025)
- **Pierceson Coody** WD prior to the second round
- **Adam Schenk** WD during the second round with a lower back injury
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- **Keegan Bradley** (T64/-3) makes the cut on the number to keep his Playoffs hopes alive; currently projected No. 73 after entering the week No. 72 in the standings; seeking to extend his streak of consecutive Playoffs appearances to 16
