- The 54-hole leader/co-leader has gone on to win 11 of 32 individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season, most recently 3M Open winner Jackson Koivun

Michael Brennan (T1/-16)

- Records eight birdies against one bogey (No. 2) for a 7-under 63
- Holds second 54-hole lead/co-lead in an individual stroke-play event (1-for-1 to date, 2025 Bank of Utah Championship)
- 54-hole score of 194 marks career best (previous: 196 twice, 2025 Bank of Utah Championship/Won, 2026 Rocket Classic/T15)
- Seeks his second PGA TOUR title in his 29th career start
- Won the 2025 Bank of Utah Championship as a sponsor exemption in his third PGA TOUR start, becoming the seventh player on record to earn his first PGA TOUR title within his first three career starts
- In 22 starts on TOUR this season, owns four top-25 finishes and one top-10 (T6/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Entered the week No. 105 in the standings, needs a 3-way T2 or better to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs
- Finished No. 12 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking after four seasons at Wake Forest University (2020-24), where he earned eight individual victories, tied for third most in program history at the time

Beau Hossler (T1/-16)

- 18-and-36-hole leader cards a third-round 66 to share the lead with Michael Brennan
- Holds fifth 54-hole lead/co-lead in an individual stroke-play event (0-for-4 to date, most recently finishing T4 at the 2022 Valero Texas Open)
- Ranks No.1 this week in Strokes Gained: Putting (7.652)
- Makes seventh appearance at the Wyndham Championship with his two best results coming in his two most recent starts (T12/2024, T15/2025)
- Seeks his first PGA TOUR title in his 252nd start (best finish is runner-up four times, most recent: P2/2024 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- Sits third on the list of active players with the most PGA TOUR starts without a win (entering this week): **Patrick Rodgers** (333), **Mark Hubbard** (282), **Beau Hossler** (251), Sam Ryder (241 – not in the field this week), **Zac Blair** (237), **Denny McCarthy** (233)
- With a win, would become the fourth consecutive first-time winner on TOUR this season (nine first-time winners total): Stefano Mazzoli (Corales Puntacana Championship), Jackson Koivun (3M Open), Michael Thorbjornsen (Rocket Classic)
 - The Wyndham Championship has had 23 first-time winners, including three of the last four (Tom Kim/2022, Aaron Rai/2024, Cameron Young/2025)
- Currently No. 122 in the standings, needs a win to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs
- Owns one top-10 finish in 18 starts this season (T3/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)

Additional notes:

- 2022 Wyndham Championship winner **Tom Kim** (3rd/-15) looks to become the 11th multiple winner of the event and fifth player this season to have multiple wins (2026 Genesis Scottish Open), joining Matt Fitzpatrick (3), Chris Gotterup (3),

Wyndham Clark (2), Cameron Young (2); Kim is the youngest winner of the Wyndham Championship after his victory in 2022 at 20 years, 1 month, 17 days

- Greensboro resident and Sedgefield Country Club member **Alex Smalley** (T4/-14) seeks his first PGA TOUR title in his 148th start (owns two T2 finishes this season: Zurich Classic of New Orleans, PGA Championship)
- **Alex Noren** (T4/-14) posts a 5-under 65 highlighted by an eagle on No. 5; seeks his maiden victory on TOUR in his 213th start (best finish is runner-up three times, most recent: 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship); looks to become the 21st international player (22nd win) of the event and the fourth from Sweden (Jesper Parnevik/1999, Carl Pettersson/2008, Henrik Stenson/2017)
- **Davis Thompson** (6th/-13) records an albatross on the par-5 fifth, holing out from 186 yards with an 8-iron en route to a third-round 65; marks the first albatross of his career on TOUR, third on No. 5 at Sedgefield Country Club and fourth on the PGA TOUR this season; Thompson is in search of his second TOUR victory in his 117th career start (2024 John Deere Classic)
- **Jordan Smith** (T8/-11) aces the par-3 16th hole from 169 yards with a 9-iron for his second career hole-in-one on TOUR (other: 2022 Genesis Scottish Open/R2/No. 17); PGA TOUR rookie seeks first career victory on TOUR in his 39th start (best finish: 3rd/2026 Valspar Championship)
- **Nico Echavarria** (T8/-11) posts a bogey-free 62 highlighted by an eagle on No. 5 to set his career-low 18-hole score (previous best: 63 six times, most recent: R1/2026 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches); owns three top-10 finishes in 21 starts this season highlighted by a victory at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches

FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will qualify for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs)
- Players currently moving into the top 70:
 - **Michael Brennan** (T1), from No. 105 to No. 47
 - **Beau Hossler** (T1), from No. 122 to No. 54
- Players currently falling out of the top 70:
 - **Matti Schmid** (T58), from No. 67 to No. 71
 - **Steven Fisk** (MC), from No. 69 to No. 72
- Currently sitting at No. 72 in the FedExCup standings, **Keegan Bradley** (T58/-4) needs a 2-way T38 or better for a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs and extend his streak of consecutive Playoffs appearances to 16
