Michael Brennan (Won/-22)

- Wins second PGA TOUR title in his 29th start at age 24 years, 6 months (2025 Bank of Utah Championship)
- Becomes third consecutive winner on the PGA TOUR under the age of 25: Jackson Koivun/3M Open (21), Michael Thorbjornsen/Rocket Classic (24)
- Cards five consecutive birdies on Nos. 4-8; made a career-best eight consecutive birdies in a first-round 65 at last week's Rocket Classic
- Now 2-for-2 in converting the 54-hole lead/co-lead in an individual stroke-play events (2025 Bank of Utah Championship); the 54-hole leader/co-leader has gone on to win 12 of 33 individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season
- 72-hole score of 258 marks career best (previous: 262, 2025 Bank of Utah Championship/Won)
- Entered the week at No. 105 in the FedExCup standings and advances to the FedExCup Playoffs at No. 47
- Won the 2025 Bank of Utah Championship as a sponsor exemption in his third PGA TOUR start, becoming the seventh player on record to earn his first PGA TOUR title within his first three career starts
- In 23 starts on TOUR this season, owns five top-25 finishes and two top-10s (Won/Wyndham Championship, T6/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Finished No. 12 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking after four seasons at Wake Forest University (2020-24), where he earned eight individual victories, tied for third most in program history at the time
- Follows Cameron Young (2025) as back-to-back Demon Deacons to win the Wyndham Championship; both Young and Brennan were Economics majors at Wake Forest University
- Comparison of third-round position, final-round score and finish in last three starts on TOUR:

Additional notes:

- After holding the 18-, 36- and 54-hole lead/co-lead, **Beau Hossler** (2nd/-19) remains in search of his first PGA TOUR title after 252 starts; sits third on the list of active players with the most PGA TOUR starts without a win: **Patrick Rodgers** (334), **Mark Hubbard** (283), **Beau Hossler** (252); required a victory to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs (finished No. 72)
- No. 1 player in the PGA TOUR University Ranking **Ben James** (3rd/-18) rebounds from a third-round 72 with a bogey-free final-round 61 to post his best finish in eight starts as a professional; cards his career low round on TOUR (previous: 62/R1/2026 Wyndham Championship); lone player at 12-under or better with a round of 72 or higher
- In his 20th start, **Kevin Yu** (4th/-16) posts his second top-10 and best finish of the season (7th/Valero Texas Open)
- England's **Harry Hall** (T5/-16) posts his best finish of the season; one of six international players to finish in the top 10 on the leaderboard
- 2022 Wyndham Championship winner **Tom Kim** (T5/-15) posts his fourth top-10 this season (T6/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, 3rd/U.S. Open, Won/Genesis Scottish Open, T5/Wyndham Championship)
- After starting the week at No. 80 in the FedExCup standings and making the cut on the number (-3), **Matt Wallace** (T7/-14) fires 64-65 on the weekend to finish in a 5-way T7; began the week needing a minimum finish of a 2-way T7 to reach No. 70 and advance to the FedExCup Playoffs (finished No. 73)

- **Jackson Koivun** (T29/-8) retains the No. 70 position in the FedExCup standings to become the first PGA TOUR University No. 1 or PGA TOUR University Accelerated graduate to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs in the same season he accepted membership; former No. 1 ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking turned professional in June, accepting PGA TOUR membership via PGA TOUR University Accelerated; became the third player to earn a TOUR card through the Accelerated program, joining Vanderbilt's Gordon Sargent and Florida State's Luke Clanton
- For the second year in a row, **Matti Schmid** (T72/-2) advances to the FedExCup Playoffs; sat No. 71 when he finished the final round almost two hours before the final pairing teed off, eventually finishing No. 69

FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings qualified for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs)
- Players who moved into the top 70:
 - **Michael Brennan** (Won), from No. 105 to No. 47
- Players who fell out of the top 70:
 - **Steven Fisk** (MC), from No. 69 to No. 71



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
