If already exempt thru 2028, add one year to exemption (max thru 2031)

Exemptions to Majors and THE PLAYERS

- 2026 PGA Championship
- 2027 PLAYERS Championship

Exemptions to Signature Events

- 2026 Cadillac Championship
- 2026 Truist Championship
- 2026 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- 2026 Travelers Championship

While the winner does not receive direct exemptions to the following events, he will improve his chances of qualifying for the following events:

- 2026 U.S. Open
 - 2026 Open Championship
 - 2026 FedEx St. Jude Championship
 - 2026 BMW Championship
 - 2026 TOUR Championship
- Top 60 Official World Golf Ranking (May 18 and June 15, 2026)
 - Top 50 Official World Golf Ranking (May 25, 2026)
 - Top 70 FedExCup Points List through Wyndham Championship
 - Top 50 FedExCup Points List through FedEx St. Jude Championship
 - Top 30 FedExCup Points List through BMW Championship

MEDICAL EXTENSIONS

Players in the field on medical extensions

Players on a Major or Minor Medical Extension who meet their top 100 points will move to a category called Top 100 (Medical), listed just below exempt players on the Priority Ranking (note: if injured in a season prior to 2025, players can move to the Top 100 Medical category by reaching their top 125 number, as that was the threshold for eligibility in the season in which they were injured; those players are noted by an asterisk *).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

Aon Swing 5

The Zurich Classic of New Orleans is the final tournament in the Second Swing, with players earning FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5 for the next two Signature Events. The Aon Swing 5 for the Cadillac Championship and Truist Championship is based on points from Puerto Rico Open, Valspar Championship, Texas Children's Houston Open, Valero Texas Open and Zurich Classic of New Orleans.

Effects of team format

Several competitions items are impacted by the team format at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, including (but not limited to):

Competition format (and playoff format)

- » First and third rounds: Four-ball
- » Second and final rounds: Foursomes
- » Playoff: hole-by-hole (sudden death); Foursomes

Top-10s

- » Players cannot qualify for the Zurich Classic via a top-10 at the previous tournament (top-10s from the Valero Texas Open and Masters Tournament qualified for the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
- » Players on the teams in the top five and ties (rather than the top 10) from the Zurich Classic qualify for the next open event (ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)

FedExCup points and Official Money

- » Alternate distribution where positions from the standard distribution are averaged by the two members of the team
- » For example, each member of the winning team gets 400 points (500 points for 1st place and 300 points for 2nd place = 800 points for the team, divided by the two members of the team) and \$1,372,750 in Official Money (18% for 1st place and 10.9% for 2nd place = 28.9% of the purse for the team, divided by the two members of the team)

Cut

- » The 36-hole cut is made to the low 33 teams and ties
