Drew Goodman (Norman, Oklahoma) carded a 9-under 61 Friday at Uplands Golf Club and shares a one-stroke lead with **Corey Pereira** (Sacramento, California) after two rounds at the Digital Commerce Group Open in Victoria, British Columbia.

A second-year member out of the University of Oklahoma, Goodman finished No. 15 in the PGA Tour University Class of 2025 to earn membership last season. He has eight top-25 finishes and four top-10s this season, with his best finish being T5 at the Explore NB Open. The 23-year-old is currently No. 16 on the PGA Tour Americas Points List.

Entering the week No. 2 on the points list, Pereira is looking to become the season's first two-time winner. In June, Pereira won the Mexico Championship presented by Scotia Wealth Management in just his sixth Tour-sanctioned start since his wife, Leah, died from a rare and highly aggressive sarcoma last year. With three events remaining in the season, Pereira is in position to finish in the top 10 on the points list and earn Korn Ferry Tour membership for the first time since 2022.

First-round leader **Ryan Voois** (Orange County, California) recorded a second-round 67 and is tied for third with **Charlie Nikitas** (Glenview, Illinois) and **Wil Gibson** (Jonesboro, Arkansas) at 12-under. **Étienne Papineau** (Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec), winner of the 2023 Digital Commerce Group Open, shot 64 Friday and is part of a seven-way tie for sixth at 11-under.

About PGA Tour Americas

PGA Tour Americas identifies and prepares the game's future stars as players compete to earn membership on the Korn Ferry Tour and eventually the PGA Tour. The 2026 schedule consists of 15 events in nine countries, and the season culminates in October with the Dominican Republic Tour Championship presented by Scotiabank, where the top 10 players on the season-long points list earn Korn Ferry Tour membership the following season.

Since the inaugural PGA Tour Americas season in 2024, Johnny Keefer (2024) and Michael Brennan (2025) have finished No. 1 on the PGA Tour Americas points list, and both players earned their PGA Tour cards for the 2026 season.

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
