Notable

- At the end of February, the course had reached its annual average yearly rainfall total of 13 inches.
- The land was known as Irvine Ranch in the 1950s and hosted the national Boy Scouts Jamboree. In 1953 there were more than 51,000 boys scouts, including President Richard Nixon, who was camping out with his old boy scout troop. The original flagpole from the jamboree is flying the courses' flags today.
- The course has connected on fairways on holes 1, 9 / 3, 5, 12 / 6, 7, 11, 14 / 10, 18, 15, 16.

- 2nd smallest greens behind only Pebble Beach (3,500 sq. ft.).
- 7th most bunkers.
- T5th fewest holes with water in play.
- The only course that had kikuyu fairways and only course with kikuyu rough.

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
