### Things to Know

- Making his PGA TOUR Champions debut, **Zach Johnson** holds a one-stroke lead entering the final round of the James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational following a bogey-free 66 on Saturday.

### Zach Johnson, 70-66 – 136 (-8)

- The 50-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions in his first start.
  - Turned 50 years old on February 24.
- Looks to become the 22nd player to win in his PGA TOUR Champions debut.
- With a win on Sunday, he would become the fourth-youngest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history (50 years, 12 days).
- Seeks his first win since the 2015 Open Championship.
  - Would snap a winless streak of 10 years, 7 months, 16 days (or 3,884 days).
    - Note: The 2015 Open was a Monday finish.
- Looks to become the 24th player to win on the PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions and Korn Ferry Tour.
  - Wins by Tour: PGA TOUR (12 wins), Korn Ferry Tour (2 wins)
  - Most recent to accomplish this feat: Tommy Gainey (2025 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS)
- Matched the low round of the day (66) with fellow Open Championship winner Pdraig Harrington (T27).
- On the PGA TOUR, he led/co-led seven times entering the final round (3-for-7).
- Won two majors on the PGA TOUR (2007 Masters Tournament, 2015 Open) and served as the U.S. Team Captain at the 2023 Ryder Cup.

### Other Notes

- In his second start on PGA TOUR Champions, **George McNeill** (T2) carded 69 and sits at 7-under. The 50-year-old finished T5 at the Chubb Classic in his Champions Tour debut last month.
- Despite a double bogey on No. 8, **Steve Allan** sits T2 at 7-under. The 52-year-old Australian seeks his fourth win on PGA TOUR Champions (50th start).
  - Last win: 2025 Boeing Classic
- Reigning Charles Schwab Cup winner **Stewart Cink** (T5) posted 72 and sits 5-under. He looks to become the 10th player in PGA TOUR Champions history to win three consecutive starts.
  - Previous instance: Steve Stricker (2023)
  - Cink's last two starts: 2025 Charles Schwab Cup Championship (Won), 2026 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (Won)
- First-round leader **Ricardo Gonzalez** (T8) bogeyed three of his first five holes en route to 75 and enters the final round at 3-under.
- **Brett Quigley** withdrew during the second round.

### Pro Football Hall of Fame Competition

- In addition to the PGA TOUR Champions 54-hole stroke play event, 26 football legends played a 36-hole competition on Friday and Saturday.
