Things to Know

- 36-hole leader **Zach Johnson** cruised to a four-stroke victory at the James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational to become the 22nd player to win his debut in PGA TOUR Champions history.

Zach Johnson, 70-66-69 – 205 (-11)

- The 50-year-old earned his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (first start).
 - Turned 50 years old on February 24.
- Becomes the 22nd player to win in his PGA TOUR Champions debut.
- Becomes the fourth-youngest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history (50 years, 12 days).
- Snaps a winless streak of 10 years, 7 months, 16 days (or 3,884 days), dating back to the 2015 Open Championship.
 - Note: The 2015 Open was a Monday finish.
- Becomes the 24th player to win on the PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions and Korn Ferry Tour.
 - Wins by Tour: PGA TOUR (12 wins), Korn Ferry Tour (2 wins), PGA TOUR Champions (1 win)
 - Most recent to accomplish this feat: Tommy Gainey (2025 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS)
- Successfully converts his first lead/co-lead entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Entered the day with a one stroke lead over George McNeill and Steve Allan.
- This is the largest margin of victory (4) on PGA TOUR Champions since the 2025 Simmons Bank Championship (Steven Alker/7 strokes).
- Becomes the first first-time winner on PGA TOUR Champions since the 2025 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS (Tommy Gainey).
- Won two majors on the PGA TOUR (2007 Masters Tournament, 2015 Open) and served as the U.S. Team Captain at the 2023 Ryder Cup.

Other Notes

- Seeking his third consecutive win on PGA TOUR Champions, **Stewart Cink** (T2) closed with 70 to post 7-under. The reigning Charles Schwab Cup winner remains atop the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
 - In his previous two starts, Cink won the 2025 Charles Schwab Cup Championship and 2026 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai.
- 50-year-old **George McNeill** closed with 72 to finish T2 at 7-under. He has finished in the top 5 in both of his starts on PGA TOUR Champions, finishing T5 at last month's Chubb Classic. McNeill turned 50 years old on October 2, 2025.
- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Padraig Harrington** (T4) carded the low round of the week by any player with bogey-free 65 to finish at 6-under. On Friday, he was T72 in the 78-player field after opening with 7-over 79.
- Open qualifier **Jamie Donaldson** finished T4 at 6-under in his first start in a PGA TOUR Champions event. The 2014 European Ryder Cup Team member turned 50 years old on October 19, 2025.
- **Mark Hensby** was disqualified due to an incorrect scorecard.
