Things to Know

- **Cameron Percy** matched the low round of the day (66) and takes a one-stroke lead over rookie **Zach Johnson** and two-time Kaulig Companies Championship winner (2020, 2022) **Jerry Kelly** into the weekend.
- **Weather Delays:** Play was suspended twice due to lightning for a total of three hours and one minute. The first delay lasted one hour and 48 minutes from 2:27 p.m. to 4:15 p.m. ET. The second delay lasted one hour and 13 minutes from 4:40 p.m. to 5:53 p.m.

Cameron Percy, 67-66 – 133 (-7)

- The 52-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (51st start).
 - Best finish: 2nd/T2 (three times)
 - 2nd (2025 Stifel Charity Classic) – lost in a playoff
 - 2nd (2025 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS)
 - T2 (2025 Principal Charity Classic) – lost in a playoff
 - Best finish in a senior major: T5 (2025 ISPS HANDA Senior Open)
- Making his 11th start of the 2026 season, he has two top-10 finishes.
 - Best finish: T3 (American Family Insurance Championship) – team event with partner Greg Chalmers
 - Entered the week ranked No. 28 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Seeks his first win since the 2014 Price Cutter Charity Championship (Korn Ferry Tour).
 - A victory on Sunday would snap a winless streak of 4,354 days (11 years, 11 months, 2 days).
- Making his third appearance at the Kaulig Companies Championship, he has finished T11 (2024) and T52 (2025).
- This is his second time leading/co-leading after the second round on PGA TOUR Champions (0-for-1).
 - Previous instance: co-led at the 2025 Senior PGA Championship – finished 7th (72-hole event)
- Looks to become the fifth first-time winner of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Previous instances: Zach Johnson (James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational), Boo Weekley (Insperity Invitational), Scott Hend (Trophy Hassan II), Ben Crane (American Family Insurance Championship)
 - Note: The American Family Insurance Championship is a team event. Crane's partner was Darren Clarke.

Jerry Kelly, 65-69 – 134 (-6)

- The 59-year-old seeks his 14th win on PGA TOUR Champions (206th start).
 - Last win: 2025 Mitsubishi Electric Classic

- Would move into T19 on the PGA TOUR Champions all-time wins list.
- Seeks his first win of the 2026 season (11th start).
 - Best finish: 14th (Mitsubishi Electric Classic) – Modified Stableford
 - Entered the week ranked No. 53 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
 - This would be his eighth different season with a win on PGA TOUR Champions since joining in 2017.
- Seeks his third senior major title (43rd start).
 - Previous wins: 2020 Kaulig Companies Championship, 2022 Kaulig Companies Championship
- Seeks his third win at the Kaulig Companies Championship (10th start).
 - Previous wins: 2020 (Firestone), 2022 (Firestone)
 - Owns five top-4 finishes in nine starts at this event; in addition to his victories: 2nd (2021), 3rd (2024), T4 (2018)
 - Looks to match Bernhard Langer for the most wins in Kaulig Companies Championship history (3).
- With a victory on Sunday, he would become the oldest winner of the 2026 season (59 years, 7 months, 19 days).
 - Oldest winner of 2026: David Toms (Chubb Classic): 59 years, 1 month, 11 days

Zach Johnson, 67-67 – 134 (-6)

- The 50-year-old seeks his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (ninth start).
 - Previous wins: 2026 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational, 2026 Principal Charity Classic
- The rookie has finished in the top 8 in each of his eight starts this season on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Entered the week ranked No. 3 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
 - Turned 50 years old on February 24.
 - In last week's PGA TOUR event (John Deere Classic), he finished T9.
- Seeks his first senior major title (second start).
 - Previous senior major finish: T8 (2026 Senior PGA Championship)
 - Won two majors on the PGA TOUR (2007 Masters Tournament, 2015 Open Championship).
- Looks to become the second three-time winner of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions, joining Stewart Cink (4 wins).
- Is making his first appearance at the Kaulig Companies Championship.
 - Made 15 appearances at Firestone Country Club on the PGA TOUR (2004-18) and earned five top-10 finishes.
 - Best finish: 2nd (2017 World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational)

Other Notes

- **Boo Weekley** (4th) shot bogey-free 67 and sits 5-under at the halfway point.
- 2019 champion and World Golf Hall of Fame member **Retief Goosen** (T5) posted 67 and sits at 4-under.
- Charles Schwab No. 9 **Darren Clarke**, who won the 2003 World Golf Championships-NEC Invitational (played at Firestone Country Club), sits T5 at 4-under.
- Akron, Ohio native **Ryan Armour**, who turned 50 years old on February 27, sits T5 at 4-under after carding 68 for the second consecutive day.
- **Tag Ridings** (T5) matched the low round of the day (66) and enters the weekend at 4-under.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader **Stewart Cink** (T9) is 3-under after carding 68. Cink, who won the 2004 World Golf Championships-NEC Invitational (played at Firestone Country Club), won the first two senior majors of the 2026 season (Senior PGA Championship, Regions Tradition).
- **Dicky Pride** (illness) withdrew before the start of the second round. World Golf Hall of Fame member **Davis Love III** (thumb injury) withdrew during the second round.
