Things to Know

- 54-hole leader **Zach Johnson** closed with 68 en route to a six-stroke victory at the Kaulig Companies Championship to earn his third win of his rookie season on PGA TOUR Champions and first senior major title.

Zach Johnson, 67-67-63-68 – 265 (-15)

- The 50-year-old earned his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (nine starts).
 - 2026 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational (March 6-8)
 - 2026 Principal Charity Classic (June 12-14)
 - 2026 Kaulig Companies Championship (July 9-12)
- Becomes the first player to win back-to-back starts on PGA TOUR Champions since Stewart Cink (2026 Hoag Classic, 2026 Senior PGA Championship).
 - Johnson's previous start on PGA TOUR Champions was the 2026 Principal Charity Classic (June 12-14).
 - Note: Johnson played in last week's PGA TOUR event (John Deere Classic) and finished T9.
- Becomes the second three-time winner of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions, joining Stewart Cink (4 wins).
- The rookie has finished in the top 8 in each of his nine starts this season on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Moves up to No. 2 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings after starting the week at No. 3.
 - Turned 50 years old on February 24.
- Earned his first senior major title (two starts).
 - Previous senior major finish: T8 (2026 Senior PGA Championship)
 - Won two majors on the PGA TOUR (2007 Masters Tournament, 2015 Open Championship).
- This was his first appearance at the Kaulig Companies Championship.
 - Made 15 appearances at Firestone Country Club on the PGA TOUR (2004-18) and earned five top-10 finishes.
 - Best finish: 2nd (2017 World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational)
- Improved to 3-for-4 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (1-for-1 in 72-hole events).
 - Led by four strokes entering the final round this week.
- Earned an exemption into the 2027 PLAYERS Championship.
- This is the low 72-hole score (265) in the eight years at Firestone Country Club for the Kaulig Companies Championship, dating back to 2019.
 - Previous low at Firestone: 269 (two times); Jerry Kelly (2022), Steve Stricker (2023)

- Low 72-hole score in Kaulig Companies Championship history: 261 (two times); Kenny Perry (2013 at Fox Chapel Golf Club), Jack Nicklaus (1990 at Dearborn Country Club)
- This is the low 72-hole score of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Previous low: 268, Padraig Harrington (U.S. Senior Open)
 - Note: This is the fourth 72-hole event of the 2026 season.
- Matched the largest margin of victory of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions (6).
 - Previous instance: Stewart Cink (Senior PGA Championship) – 72-hole event

Other Notes

- **Boo Weekley** matched the low round of the day (66) en route to runner-up honors at 9-under. This is Weekley's third top-2 finish of the 2026 season (15 starts) as he moves up to No. 4 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
 - T2 (Chubb Classic)
 - Won (Insperity Invitational)
 - 2nd (Kaulig Companies Championship)
- Rookie **Rory Sabbatini**, who turned 50 years old on April 2, finished 3rd at 8-under. This is Sabbatini's third top-3 finish in an event at Firestone Country Club (nine starts).
 - T2 at the 2004 World Golf Championships-NEC Invitational (PGA TOUR)
 - T2 at the 2007 World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational (PGA TOUR)
 - 3rd at the 2026 Kaulig Companies Championship (PGA TOUR Champions)
- Charles Schwab Cup leader **Stewart Cink** who won the 2004 World Golf Championships-NEC Invitational (played at Firestone Country Club), finished 4th at 7-under.
 - Cink has been atop the Charles Schwab Cup standings for all 15 weeks of the 2026 season.
 - Cink's finishes in 2026 senior majors (chronologically):
 - Won (Senior PGA Championship)
 - Won (Regions Tradition)
 - 2nd (U.S. Senior Open)
 - 4th (Kaulig Companies Championship)
- Defending champion **Miguel Angel Jiménez** (T8) bogeyed four of his last six holes to close with 74.
- Akron, Ohio native **Ryan Armour**, who turned 50 years old on February 27, finished T23 at 1-over.
- **Justin Leonard** was disqualified under Rule 3.3 for signing an incorrect scorecard. In the third round, he took improper relief from a sprinkler head on Hole No. 6. Leonard notified the committee on Saturday night.
- **John Daly** (arm injury) withdrew before the start of the final round.
