## Things to Know

- Reigning Charles Schwab Cup winner and PGA TOUR Champions Player of the Year **Stewart Cink** matched the low round of the day with bogey-free 64 to open the 2026 season with a victory at the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai.

## Stewart Cink, 66-63-64 – 193 (-23)

- The 52-year-old earned his fifth win on PGA TOUR Champions (37 starts).
  - Wins (5): 2024 Ally Challenge, 2025 Insperity Invitational, 2025 Ally Challenge, 2025 Charles Schwab Cup Championship, 2026 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai
- Becomes the first player to win back-to-back tournaments on PGA TOUR Champions since Ángel Cabrera (2025 Regions Tradition, 2025 Senior PGA Championship).
  - Cink won the 2025 Charles Schwab Cup Championship (final event of 2025 PGA TOUR Champions season)
- This is his low 54-hole score in an individual stroke play event on PGA TOUR Champions (193).
  - Previous low: 197 (2025 Charles Schwab Cup Championship)
    - Note: this was a 72-hole event
- Earned his first win at the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (three starts).
  - Previous finishes: T5 (2024), T8 (2025)
- Led the field in birdies (24) and ranked T1 in driving distance (312.2 yards).
- Improved to 2-for-7 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Becomes the first Charles Schwab Cup leader of the 2026 season after closing the 2025 season by winning the Charles Schwab Cup.
- Was named 2025 PGA TOUR Champions Player of the Year (Jack Nicklaus Award) on Tuesday night.

## Other Notes

- First timer at Hualalai **Ángel Cabrera** finished runner-up at 20-under after closing with 66. Cabrera ranked T1 in driving distance this week with Cink (312.2 yards).
- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Retief Goosen** (3rd) matched Cink for the low round of the day (64) to finish at 18-under. This is Goosen's fourth top-6 at the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (six starts).
  - Previous top-6 finishes: T4 (2020), 2nd (2021), T6 (2022)

- Three players finished T4 at 17-under: defending champion and World Golf Hall of Fame member **Ernie Els**, 36-hole co-leader and first timer at Hualalai **Freddie Jacobson** and first timer at Hualalai **Thomas Bjørn**.
- 68-year-old **Bernhard Langer** (T9) carded 68 to shoot his age or better for the second consecutive day and 37th time overall on PGA TOUR Champions. The World Golf Hall of Fame member is a three-time winner of the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (2009, 2014, 2017).
- 72-year-old **Jay Haas** (T24) posted 72 to shoot his age or better for the third consecutive day and 41st time overall on PGA TOUR Champions.
