### Things to Know

- 18-hole leader **Zach Johnson** (+28) scored 13 points in Modified Stableford on Saturday and sits three points ahead of World Golf Hall of Fame member **Retief Goosen** (+25) entering the final round of the Mitsubishi Electric Classic presented by Vensure.
- The Mitsubishi Electric Classic is being played under the Modified Stableford scoring format.
  - Albatross: 8 points
  - Eagle: 5 points
  - Birdie: 2 points
  - Par: 0 points
  - Bogey: -1 point
  - Double bogey or more: -3 points

### Zach Johnson (+28)

- The 50-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (fifth start).
  - Previous win: 2026 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational
- Has finished in the top 10 in each of his four previous starts since turning 50 years old on February 24.
  - Other finishes after winning his debut (chronologically): T3 (Cologuard Classic), T2 (Hoag Classic), T8 (Senior PGA Championship)
  - Entered the week ranked No. 2 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Looks to become the second multi-time winner of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions.
  - Multi-time winner in 2026: Stewart Cink (3 wins)
  - Note: this is the seventh event of the 2026 season.
- Looks to become the second player to win at TPC Sugarloaf on both the PGA TOUR and PGA TOUR Champions.
  - Previous instance: Scott McCarron (1997, 2001 BellSouth Classic; 2019 Mitsubishi Electric Classic)
  - Johnson was a two-time winner of the BellSouth Classic (2004, 2007).
- With a win, he would match Stephen Ames, Scott McCarron and Phil Mickelson for the most wins at TPC Sugarloaf in PGA TOUR-sanctioned events (3).
- Looks to become the first wire-to-wire winner on PGA TOUR Champions since the 2025 Simmons Bank Championship (Steven Alker).
- Looks to become the third wire-to-wire winner in Mitsubishi Electric Classic history.
  - Previous instances: Miguel Angel Jiménez (2014), Scott McCarron (2019)

- This is his second time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (1-for-1).
  - Previous instance: 2026 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational (Won)
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the second time this season (1-for-1).
  - Previous instance: James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational (Won)

**Other Notes**

- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Retief Goosen** (+25), who won the 2002 BellSouth Classic at TPC Sugarloaf and is a past winner in Modified Stableford (2005 INTERNATIONAL), sits in 2nd.
  - The 57-year-old seeks his fifth win on PGA TOUR Champions (150th start).
    - Last win: 2025 Sanford International
- Three rookies (**Rory Sabbatini**, **Ben Crane** and **George McNeill**) and **David Duval** sit T3 (+21). They are each seeking their first win on PGA TOUR Champions.
  - Sabbatini is making his second start on PGA TOUR Champions since turning 50 years old on April 2.
  - Crane won the 2003 BellSouth Classic, played at TPC Sugarloaf.
  - McNeill entered the week ranked No. 10 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
  - Duval, who attended Georgia Tech, won the 1999 BellSouth Classic, played at TPC Sugarloaf.
- Three-time champion (2017, 2023, 2024) **Stephen Ames** (+18) scored the most points on Saturday (+16) and enters the final round sitting T10.
- Making his 200th start on PGA TOUR Champions, defending champion **Jerry Kelly** (+17) sits T13.
- Tournament host and Charles Schwab Cup leader **Stewart Cink** (+16) sits T16. Cink won his two most recent starts (Hoag Classic, Senior PGA Championship).
