Things to Know

- Iowa native **Zach Johnson** carded the low score of the day (63) and enters the final round of the Principal Charity Classic tied for the lead with **Brett Quigley** and Charles Schwab No. 5 **Scott Hend**.
 - This is the highest number of players tied for the 36-hole lead on PGA TOUR Champions since the 2025 U.S. Senior Open (3), which was a 72-hole event.
 - The last time three or more players were tied for the 36-hole lead of a 54-hole event was the 2024 DICK'S Open (3).
- **Weather Delay:** Play was suspended due to inclement weather for one hour and 30 minutes from 10:48 a.m. CT to 12:18 p.m. CT.

Zach Johnson, 69-63 – 132 (-12)

- The 50-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (eighth start).
 - Last win: 2026 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational
- The Iowa native has finished in the top 10 in each of his seven starts since turning 50 years old on February 24.
 - Entered the week ranked No. 2 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Matched his low 18-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (18th individual stroke play round).
 - Previous instance: 63 (2026 Hoag Classic, 1st Round)
- This is his low 36-hole on PGA TOUR Champions in an individual stroke play event (132).
 - Previous low: 133 (two times; 2026 Cologuard Classic, 2026 Hoag Classic)
- Looks to become the second multi-time winner of the 2026 season, joining Stewart Cink (4).
- Looks to become the fourth player to win the Principal Charity Classic in his first appearance.
 - Previous instances: Jim Thorpe (2001), Jay Haas (2007), Scott McCarron (2016)
- This is his third time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (1-for-2).
 - Led at the 2026 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational (Won)
 - Led at the 2026 Mitsubishi Electric Classic (finished 3rd) – Modified Stableford scoring
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the third time this season (1-for-2).
 - James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational (Won)
 - Mitsubishi Electric Classic (finished 3rd) – Modified Stableford scoring

Brett Quigley, 67-65 – 132 (-12)

- The 56-year-old seeks his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (136th start).
 - Last win: 2023 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS
- Making his eighth start of the 2026 season, he has one top-10 finish.
 - Best finish: T10 (American Family Insurance Championship) – team event with partner Jason Caron
- Was third alternate when the field was released on Friday.
 - Last alternate to win: Angel Cabrera (2025 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational)
 - Note: Cabrera was second alternate at that event.
- Making his sixth appearance at the Principal Charity Classic, he has two top-10 finishes.
 - Best finish: 5th (2022)
- This is his seventh time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (1-for-6).
 - Most recent: Led at the 2023 Dominion Energy Charity Classic (finished 3rd)
 - Successful conversion: Led at the 2023 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS (Won)
 - This is his second time leading/co-leading entering the final round of the Principal Charity Classic.
 - Previous instance: co-led in 2022 (finished 5th)
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the first time this season.

Scott Hend, 65-67 – 132 (-12)

- The 52-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (13th start).
 - Last win: 2026 Trophy Hassan II
- In three starts on PGA TOUR Champions in 2026, he has finished (chronologically): T3 (Senior PGA Championship), 2nd (Regions Tradition), Won (Trophy Hassan II).
 - Entered the week ranked No. 5 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- This is his low 36-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (132).
 - Previous low: 134 (2026 Senior PGA Championship) – finished T3
- Looks to become the second multi-time winner of the 2026 season, joining Stewart Cink (4).
- Looks to become the first player to win back-to-back starts on PGA TOUR Champions since Stewart Cink (2026 Hoag Classic, 2026 Senior PGA Championship).
- Looks to become the fourth player to win the Principal Charity Classic in his first appearance.
 - Previous instances: Jim Thorpe (2001), Jay Haas (2007), Scott McCarron (2016)
- This is his first time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Previous best position: T2 (2026 Trophy Hassan II) – Won
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the second time this season (1-for-1).
 - Previous instance: Trophy Hassan II (Won)

Other Notes

- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Retief Goosen** (T4) carded 64 and enters the final round at 11-under. The 57-year-old seeks his second win of the 2026 season (10th start) and sixth win overall on PGA TOUR Champions (154th start).
 - Last win: 2026 Mitsubishi Electric Classic (Modified Stableford scoring)
- 2025 co-runner-up **Søren Kjeldsen** (T4) posted bogey-free 65 and enters the final round at 11-under. The 51-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (28th start).
 - Best finish: T2 (two times; 2025 Principal Charity Classic, 2025 American Family Insurance Championship – team event with partner Alex Cejka)
- **David Bransdon** (T4) eagled No. 18 en route to bogey-free 66. The 52-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (48th start).
 - Best finish: 3rd (2024 Dominion Energy Charity Classic)
- World Golf Hall of Fame member **José María Olazábal** (T7) is the lone player in the field without a bogey or worse after 36 holes.
- First-round co-leader **George McNeill** (T10) carded 70 and sits at 9-under.
