Things to Know

- Charles Schwab Cup leader **Stewart Cink** closes in 3-under 69 and converts a three-stroke 54-hole lead into a three-stroke victory at the Regions Tradition presented by Coca-Cola, earning his fourth victory of the 2026 PGA TOUR Champions season and securing his second senior major title.

Stewart Cink, 65-65-71-69– 270 (-18)

- The 52-year-old Huntsville, Alabama native earns his eighth career win on PGA TOUR Champions (43 career starts), and his second senior major title (2026 Senior PGA Championship).
- Becomes the third player in the last two seasons to win back-to-back senior majors (Ángel Cabrera/2025 Regions Tradition and 2025 Senior PGA Championship; Padraig Harrington/2025 U.S. Senior Open Championship and 2025 ISPS HANDA Senior Open).
- Secures his first PGA TOUR Champions season with four-plus wins, earning his fourth title in his seventh start of the 2026 season; the most victories by a PGA TOUR Champions player in 2025 was four (Miguel Angel Jiménez).
 - Wins in 2026 (four): Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai, Hoag Classic, Senior PGA Championship, Regions Tradition
 - Wins in 2025 (three): Insperity Invitational, The Ally Challenge, Charles Schwab Cup Championship
 - Wins in 2024 (one): The Ally Challenge
- Becomes the seventh Regions Tradition winner to lead/co-lead through 18, 36, and 54 holes (Steve Stricker/2022, Miguel Angel Jiménez/2018, Jeff Maggert/2015, Doug Tewell/2001, Gil Morgan/1997, Raymond Floyd/1994)
 - Cink was the co-leader (with Alex Cejka) through 18 holes, held a two-stroke lead through 36 holes, and held a three-stroke lead through 54 holes.
- Improves to 4-for-9 converting to victory when leading/co-leading entering the final round of a PGA TOUR Champions event (previous wins: 2024 Ally Challenge, 2026 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai, 2026 Hoag Classic).
- Posts the largest margin of victory (three strokes) at the Regions Tradition since 2023 (Steve Stricker/six strokes).
- Wins in his third appearance at the Regions Tradition (previous finishes: T3/2024, T12/2025).
- Makes a field-leading 26 birdies, his highest total in a PGA TOUR Champions event (previous: 2026 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai/24).
- Will stand No. 1 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings for a ninth consecutive week off the strength of four wins (Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai, Hoag Classic, Senior PGA Championship).

Other Notes

- Making his 11th career start on PGA TOUR Champions, 52-year-old **Scott Hend** (2nd/-15) closes in 7-under 65, tying the low round of the tournament, for his fourth top-five finish in a senior major (2026 Senior PGA Championship/T3, 2025 ISPS HANDA Senior Open/4th, 2024 Senior PGA Championship/T4).
- Playing in the final group of the final round for the first time since 2020, 62-year-old World Golf Hall of Fame member **Colin Montgomerie** (3rd/-13) records his second top-three finish since the start of 2021 (2023 Insperity Invitational/T3), as well as his highest finish in a senior major since a runner-up finish at the 2016 Senior PGA Championship.
- Making his tournament debut, 50-year-old **Søren Kjeldsen** (4th/-12) records his first top-five finish of the 2026 season, and his fifth such finish in 24 career starts on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Tuscaloosa, Alabama native and University of Alabama alum **Dicky Price** (T15/-8) records his best finish at the Regions Tradition since 2023 (finished T15).
